



# STATE BAR OF NEVADA ELECTIONS

## 2022 Nominating Petition

The Board of Governors of the State Bar consists of 15 members elected by the active members of the Bar who are residents of Nevada and have their official address per SCR 79 in the respective districts. There are fifteen members as follows:

- **Nine from District One (Clark County)**
- **One from District Two (White Pine, Elko, Eureka, Churchill, Lander, Humboldt, Lyon, Lincoln, Douglas, Mineral, Nye, Esmeralda, Pershing and Storey Counties)**
- **One from District Three (Carson City)**
- **Four from District Four (Washoe County)**

The terms of office are staggered with each elected for a term of three years.

For 2022, the following positions are open for election.

### District One – Clark County Four seats

### District Three - Carson City One seat

### District Four – Washoe County Two seats
