ORDER

All persons, and all items carried by such persons, entering the Supreme Court Buildings in Carson City and Las Vegas or any place where the Supreme Court of Nevada, or any of its justices, are conducting judicial proceedings, are subject to appropriate screening and checking by officers assigned to duty in the Supreme Court. No cameras, recording, reproducing or transmitting equipment (including telephones) are permitted in judicial proceedings, unless prior approval has been obtained from the Supreme Court. Any person who refuses to cooperate in such screening or checking shall be denied entrance.

All persons entering the Supreme Court Buildings in Carson City and Las Vegas or any place where the Supreme Court of Nevada, or any of its justices, are conducting judicial proceedings, shall be disarmed, except where (1) The person is a law enforcement officer assigned to duty in the Supreme Court or is a law enforcement officer responding to a request for assistance from a law enforcement officer assigned to duty in the Supreme Court; (2) The person is guarding incarcerated persons in the Supreme Court; (3) Prior approval has been obtained from the Supreme Court (4) or The person is permitted to carry a concealed firearm pursuant

to NRS 202.3673(4)(a). Any person who refuses to surrender custody of weapons when requested to do so shall be denied entrance.

It is so ORDERED.
