Music to Pro Bono Cases Placed Family Law Conference

The idea arose three decades ago: The Annual Family Law CLE conference would become the place where all family law practitioners would break bread together, under one roof, and make peace with one another following a year of facing off in rancorous divorce cases. In addition to helping with attorney civility, promoting uniformity in the treatment of cases statewide, and leading to discussions on legislation and trends from the Supreme Court, the conference has become a forum in which to place pro bono cases. Much has been accomplished for pro bono, but there is more work to be done.

The Family Law Section has held its annual conference in a rural setting for nearly 30 years. It moved from Tonopah to Ely, and it is currently taking place in Bishop, California. The location makes a difference; under one roof, in the middle of nowhere and away from our offices, there are fewer distractions and we have to actually face each other.

About a decade ago, as I became more active with the Family Law Section (in the capacity of an Executive Council

member), promoting the placement of pro bono cases became a

personal project. To assist Nevada Legal Services, Volunteer Attorneys of Rural Nevada, Washoe Legal Services and Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada, we tried everything we could think of to place roughly 80 cases per year. Our efforts included asking with the help of a district court judge or Supreme Court justice (always effective),

a pie sale from a local Ely baker—take a case and bring home a pie (less effective, but very tasty)—and free midyear CLE seminars for those taking on new cases (not quite the free pie, but also an effective, persuasive tool).

Borrowing an idea from greater minds, I bought a nice guitar and had a local luthier dress it up with Nevada emblems. Judge Bryce Duckworth then carried it around for signatures at the judge's annual conference that took place shortly before the Family Law Conference; thus, the birth of the "Judge and Justice" signed guitar. Conference attendees took a pro bono case and received a lottery ticket representing a chance to win the guitar. The idea was a hit; 80 cases up, 80 cases down. Ten guitars of different shapes and colors now dot the Nevada law office landscape. In that span, about 800 cases—all representing indigent families in great need—have been served by our section members. We had fun with the guitars, but seeing the number of families served is the real reward.

This past March, <u>TrueFire.com</u>, an online guitar lesson company that offers some of the best courses available, donated 400 90-day subscriptions to all Family Law Conference attendees, along with a one-year subscription to the guitar lottery winner. Somewhere out there, live a lot of aspiring guitar pickers moonlighting as lawyers.

2019 marks the 30th anniversary of the Family Law Conference. It will again take place in Bishop, California. National and Nevada speakers will present on a variety of Family Law topics. Grab a pick and sit in with us in Bishop... and think about taking on a pro bono case. Your guitar is waiting for you! **NL**
