# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

State Bar President, Richard Dreitzer called the meeting to order at 9:27 a.m.

## DISCUSSION

## Why DEI is Important

The Board engaged in a discussion about diversity, and what the term means to the Board when we discuss diversity-related programs and initiatives. The discussion included a conversation as to why inclusion initiatives are important. The exchange covered history of the state bar's diversity initiatives and the goal of bringing awareness to the importance of a diverse bar.

## **REPORTS/ACTION**

## Public Comment Policy

The Board reviewed and approved a Public Comment Policy. The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for members who wish to appear before the Board of Governors during the designated public comment periods at the scheduled Board of Governors meetings. It was moved, seconded and carried to approve Policy 17 Public Comment Policy.

#### Licensing of Past Bar Exam Questions

The Board of Bar Examiners (BBX) found that commercial bar preparation companies (i.e. BARBRI, Kaplan, Ameribar) are using and reproducing past Nevada bar exam essay questions as part of their Nevada bar exam preparation courses. The Admissions office occasionally receives requests to license bar exam questions from other bar preparation companies, which means there is a benefit to and interest in providing licenses to use past Nevada bar exam questions in Nevada bar preparation materials.

The BBX proposed licensing of past bar exam essay questions. This initiative will stop companies from using Nevada bar essay questions without permission from and compensation to the State Bar of Nevada and create a source of revenue. It was moved, seconded and carried to approve the licensing of past bar exam questions.

# Update on the Nevada Plan

Rick Trachok, John Desmond, and Professor Joan Horwath, members of the Board of Bar Examiners and principals on the Nevada Plan Taskforce, provided updates on the development of the Nevada Plan and answered questions from the Board.

It is anticipated that the 2027 graduating class will have to satisfy the requirements of the Nevada Plan.

# **Business Law Section Legislative Proposal**

Per the policy of the Board of Governors, sections' legislative proposals are presented to the Board prior to the section presenting revisions to Nevada's Legislature. The Business Law Section's revised proposal was presented by Rob Kim. It was moved, seconded and carried to approve the legislative proposal. The section may take the legislative position and may assert that the legislative position is endorsed by the Board of Governors.

# Financial Report

Finance Director Marc Mersol provided an overview of the 2025 Operating Budget. It was moved, seconded and carried to approve the 2025 budget as presented and recommended by the Budget Committee, which includes Boad members Andrew Craner, Terry Coffing, and Kari Stephens.

# Office of Bar Counsel Report

Bar Counsel Daniel Hooge presented discipline statistics covering intake, investigations, and hearings.

- The OBC aims to keep active cases under 250. This goal allows for about half of cases (125) to be in the investigation phase and half of the remaining cases (125) split between the intake, screening, and hearing phases.
- The OBC works efficiently with active cases below 250. We are within that range.
- Of the 1,003 grievances the OBC has processed through October 1, 2024, 60 percent named solo and small firm attorneys, with the remainder split between attorneys at medium to large firms, government attorneys, or grievances that do not name a Nevada-licensed attorney.
- Through October 1, 2024, the OBC has referred 129 grievances (13 percent) to investigation. Of those referred, 104 (81 percent) related to solo or small firm attorneys.
- In 2024, grievances referred to investigation regarding solo or small firm attorneys equates to approximately 17.5 percent of grievances received in those categories.
- Of the grievances received through October 1, 2024, clients have consistently submitted the most at 49 percent with opposing parties second at 19 percent.
- 85 percent of grievances received related to the southern district, with 15 percent related to the northern district.
- Of the 129 grievances referred to investigation in 2024, lack of diligence and communication continue to be the most common issues raised.
- Other prevalent issues raised in grievances referred to investigation in 2024 relate to issues under RPC 8.4 (Misconduct), RPC 1.5 (Fees), and RPC 3.2 (Expediting Litigation).
