

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Legislative Stats from 82nd Regular Session

- Total pieces of legislation requested: 1,234
- Total pieces of legislation introduced: 1,089 (556 Assembly, 533 Senate)
 - 145 drafted pieces of legislation abandoned; 88.2% introduction rate
- Total pieces of legislation passed: 648 (610 bills and 38 resolutions)
 - 441 pieces of legislation died; 59.5% passage rate from introduced, 52.5% from requested
- Total bills that became law: 535 (75 vetoed record for single session)
 - Previous single session record: 48 vetoes (Gov. Jim Gibbons, 2009)
 - All-time cumulative record: 97 (Gov. Brian Sandoval, 2011-2019)
- Subsequent special sessions: 2 (so far...) 34th Special Session for capital improvement projects bill, 35th Special Session for Las Vegas baseball stadium bill

Pending Ballot Questions for 2024

(as a result of actions of 2023 Legislature)

- AJR10 (81st Session): Removes language authorizing use of slavery and involuntary servitude as criminal punishment from Nevada Constitution
- SJR7 (81st Session): Removes provisions governing election and duties of Board of Regents of State University from Nevada Constitution and authorizes Legislature to provide by statute for governance of State University and audits of institutions of higher education
- AJR1 (81st Session): Adds and revises terms in the Nevada Constitution which are now considered derogatory relating to certain persons

Possible Ballot Questions for 2026

(if approved by 2025 Legislature)

- SJR7 (82nd Session): Amends Nevada Constitution to establish certain rights relating to reproductive health
- AJR6 (82nd Session): Amends Nevada Constitution to adopt the National Popular Vote Compact
- AJR5 (82nd Session): Amends Nevada Constitution to authorize certain lotteries

Laws effective before July 1, 2023

Senate Bill No. 124 (Ch. 2, Stats. 2023)

Effective February 27, 2023

- Net proceeds of minerals (NPM) revenue deposited directly in State Education Fund and apportioned to school districts, rather than routed through county treasurer
 - Effect: county treasurers no longer handle or take a 5% commission from such revenue
- School district reserves capped at 16.6% of actual, rather than budgeted, ending fund balance
 - Clarifies that certain NPM revenues are exempt from reserve cap
 - Excludes money deposited in county school district fund before June 30, 2020, from reserve cap
- NPM revenue is treated as first money received and first money spent by school district
- Ends advance payment of NPM 1 year early (June 30, 2022, rather than June 30, 2023)
 - "Hole" from ending prepayment moved to FY2022-23, rather than FY2023-24

Assembly Bill No. 165 (Ch. 4, Stats. 2023)

Effective March 22, 2023

- Authorizes an award for permanent partial disability to be paid in a lump sum if a claimant is injured on or after July 1, 2017, and injury does not exceed 30 percent
 - Existing law authorizes lump sum payment of up to 30 percent if injury exceeds 30 percent; this change allows same treatment for injuries at or under 30 percent
 - Applies retroactively from and after July 1, 2017, and to any injury incurred on or after July 1, 2017

Assembly Bill No. 268 (Ch. 5, Stats. 2023)

Effective April 4, 2023

• Appropriates money for payment of \$500 retention incentives to State employees employed on March 31, 2023, and June 16, 2023

Senate Bill No. 441 (Ch. 9, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 17, 2023

- SB4 of the 32nd Special Session enacted various provisions relating to COVID-19, including requirements to reduce and prevent the spread of COVID-19, immunity for civil liability for certain entities that comply with health standards and authority for the Secretary of State to suspend the state business license of persons who do not comply with health standards, until the later of the termination of the declaration of emergency relating to COVID-19 or July 1, 2023
- Repeals all provisions of SB4 (32nd Special Session) on May 17, 2023, instead of July 1, 2023
 - Voids all regulations adopted by the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services and by district boards of health pursuant to SB4 (32nd SS) on May 17, 2023
 - Repeal does not affect any causes of action, claims or suspensions of state business licenses before May 17, 2023
 - Ends the immunity from civil liability created by SB4 (32nd SS) on May 17, 2023, rather than July 1, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 27 (Ch. 13, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 22, 2023

Requires a general building contractor who contracts with a prime contractor to provide
management and counseling services on a construction project for a professional fee to hold an
active license in the same classifications and subclassifications that are required to be held by the
prime contractor

Assembly Bill No. 29 (Ch. 14, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 22, 2023

• Authorizes disciplinary action by the State Contractors' Board against certain licensees or persons involved with a licensee who make or cause to be made a false or misleading statement or representation or omit a material fact in connection with the application of another person for a contractor's license for the purpose of assisting the applicant to obtain the license

Assembly Bill No. 43 (Ch. 16, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 22, 2023

- Revises certain dates related to school emergency operations plans
 - Emergency operations plan development committee must provide a copy of an updated plan to board of trustees of school district or governing body of charter school or private school on or before August 1
 - Board of trustees of school district or governing body of charter school or private school must submit copy of updated plan to Division of Emergency Management of Office of Military on or before August 15, rather than July 1
 - Chief of Division of Emergency Management must report to Superintendent of Public Instruction on whether plans comply with the law by November 15, rather than August 15

Assembly Bill No. 73 (Ch. 17, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 22, 2023

- Creates a right for pupils of public schools to wear traditional tribal regalia or recognized objects of religious or cultural significance as an adornment at a school graduation ceremony
- Board of trustees of school district and governing body of charter school or university school for profoundly gifted pupils may prohibit items that are likely to cause a substantial disruption of or material interference with a school graduation ceremony
 - Pupil may submit written appeal of such a prohibition to Superintendent of Public Instruction
 - Superintendent of Public Instruction required to consult with Nevada Indian Commission and Nevada Commission on Minority Affairs on all appeals
 - Unless Superintendent of Public Instruction denies an appeal within 5 business days after submission, public school is required to allow pupil to wear the item

Senate Bill No. 67 (Ch. 21, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 22, 2023

- Revises the definition of "sexual offense" for the purpose of certain provisions relating to parole (NRS 213.107) to match the definition of that term used in various other provisions of law (NRS 176.139, 179D.097, 179D.441, 179D.443)
 - Effect: persons convicted of certain offenses who are not currently subject to provisions relating to sexual offenses and parole will now be subject to such provisions (standards for granting parole in certain cases, risk assessment, delegation of parole hearing to panel)
 - Applies to offenses committed before, on or after May 22, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 82 (Ch. 26, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 24, 2023

- Makes the last Saturday in October "World Esports Day" in Nevada
 - Not a holiday; merely a day of observance

Senate Bill No. 2 (Ch. 31, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 24, 2023

- Authorizes Chief of Division of Emergency Management of Office of the Military to activate the State Disaster Identification Coordination Committee in preparation for an imminent emergency, disaster, public health emergency or other health event
- Requires providers of health care to submit reports to the Committee in certain circumstances and establishes contents of reports
 - Such reports deemed not to be public records
- Requires sharing of information by Committee with local governments in certain circumstances
- Transfers regulatory authority for Committee from Office of the Military to Division of Emergency Management

Senate Bill No. 406 (Ch. 35, Stats. 2023)

*Effective May 24, 2023**

- Creates category E felony for using or threatening or attempting to use force, intimidation, coercion, violent, restraint or undue influence with intent to interfere with or retaliate for performance of duties of election official relating to an election
- Creates category E felony for disseminating personal identifying information or sensitive information of election official without consent in certain circumstances
- *Prohibits Secretary of State, State Treasurer, State Controller and Attorney General from soliciting or accepting, and a lobbyist from offering to such officials, monetary contributions for political purpose during certain period before and after a legislative session
 - Existing law prohibits such activity for Legislators, Governor, Governor-Elect, Lieutenant Governor and Lieutenant Governor-Elect
 - *Provision effective October 1, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 78 (Ch. 38, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 25, 2023

• Exempts certain natural persons who provide jobs and day training services from requirement to be licensed by State Board of Nursing

Assembly Bill No. 215 (Ch. 40, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 25, 2023

• Decreases the time that a person must be a registered voter in a senatorial district to be eligible for appointment to the Nevada Silver Haired Legislative Forum from 3 years to 1 year

Assembly Bill No. 426 (Ch. 43, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 25, 2023



- Creates an exception to laws prohibiting placement of commercial advertising on or near certain highways for any sign, signal, marking or street banner bearing commercial advertising erected before, during or after a special event located on or over a highway
 - "Special event" defined as event which will have anticipated economic impact of at least \$250,000,000 and is issued a permit as a special event by public authority with jurisdiction over a highway
- Organizer of special event required to receive authorization from a public authority for such advertising and enter into written agreement for such advertising
 - Advertising prohibited from being hazard or preventing safe use of highway and allowed for up to 14 days

Senate Bill No. 16 (Ch. 52, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 29, 2023

- Revises various provisions of the Charter of Carson City
 - Requires realignment of ward boundaries upon receipt of reliable evidence, including decennial census results, indicating a variance of more than 5 percent
 - Revises the duration of the terms of Supervisors to begin at midnight on the first Monday in January following a general election and expire at 11:59 p.m. on the day immediately preceding the first Monday in January following a general election
 - Revises the style of ordinances of Carson City
 - Requires adoption or rejection of an ordinance within 60, rather than 45, days after publication
 - Requires signature, attestation and publication by title of ordinances within 14 days after adoption
 - Provides that, in the event of a vacancy in the Mayor's office, the Mayor Pro Tempore assumes the office of Mayor for the unexpired term of the former incumbent, creating a vacancy in the office of Supervisor previously held by the Mayor Pro Tempore

Senate Bill No. 19 (Ch. 54, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 29, 2023

- Authorizes the creation by a board of county commissioners of an unincorporated town consisting of certain territory given to the county by federal law for airport purposes or within 1 mile of such territory and defers the appointment of a town advisory board for such a town
- Prohibits annexation by a city of such a town without the approval of the board of county commissioners except in certain circumstances

Senate Bill No. 21 (Ch. 55, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 29, 2023

• Revises various classifications on the basis of population throughout NRS, as a result of the last preceding national decennial census and the Legislature's duty to review such classifications and determine whether the classifications continue to meet the conditions expressed by the Nevada Supreme Court for the use of population-based classifications

Senate Bill No. 23 (Ch. 57, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 29, 2023

- Authorizes the legislative body of a city whose population is less than 25,000 to amend a redevelopment plan to remove an area from the redevelopment area if the legislative body determines, following a public hearing, that:
 - The removal will not impair adversely any outstanding bonds or securities;
 - The area to be removed consists primarily of single-family residential dwellings or multi-family residential dwellings of three stories or less; and
 - The removal is necessary or desirable because it is in the public interest for the property tax revenue collected from the area that will be removed to be distributed in the same manner as property tax revenue is distributed outside the redevelopment area

Assembly Bill No. 122 (Ch. 66, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 30, 2023

• Exempts from the requirement to perform age verification for any transaction with a person under 40 years of age any sale of cigarettes, cigarette paper or other tobacco products in a face-to-face transaction within an area of a casino where persons under the age of 21 years are prohibited from loitering

Assembly Bill No. 20 (Ch. 69, Stats. 2023)

- Makes various changes relating to the Account to Finance the Construction of Treatment Works and the Implementation of Pollution Control Projects
 - Allows an "eligible recipient," meaning a legal entity eligible to receive assistance from the Account under federal law, to receive assistance from the Account
 - Transfers responsibility for administering the Account from the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to the Division of Environmental Protection of the Department and its Administrator
 - Makes certain other revisions to conform with federal law
- Makes various changes relating to the Account to Finance the Construction of Projects and the Account for Set-Aside Programs in the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
- Transfers oversight of financing of water projects from Director of Department of Business and Industry to Director of State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and State Environmental Commission
- Allows more than three members of the Board for Financing Water Projects to be members fo the same political party

Assembly Bill No. 98 (Ch. 71, Stats. 2023)

- Renames the Governor's Workforce Investment Board as the Governor's Workforce Development Board
- Requires the Governor to ensure members of the Board represent members of the local workforce development boards
- Requires the Board to collaborate with local workforce development boards and regional development authorities

Assembly Bill No. 126 (Ch. 73, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to business entities
 - · Authorizes correction of certain records filed erroneously with the Secretary of State
 - Revises requirements for inspection of business records
 - Clarifies actions available to boards of directors in certain circumstances
 - Authorizes publicly traded corporation to reduce the number of shares with certain approval
 - Revises documentation requirements relating to uncertificated shares
 - Clarifies the manner in which a transferee may be presumed to have knowledge of a restriction on the transfer of shares
 - Exempts acquisition of shares listed on a national securities exchange pursuant to a tender offer from being an acquisition of a controlling interest in an issuing corporation

Senate Bill No. 131 (Ch. 82, Stats. 2023)

- Codifies the provisions of Executive Order 2022-08, relating to access to reproductive health services
 - Prohibits a health care licensing board from disqualifying a person for licensure or subjecting a person to discipline for providing reproductive health care services lawful and consistent with standards for the practice of the relevant profession in this State
 - Prohibits Governor from surrendering or issuing a warrant of arrest for a person in this State who is charged with a crime in another state for providing or receiving reproductive health care services unless the acts forming the basis of the prosecution would also be a crime in this State
 - Prohibits state agencies from providing information or using time, money or any other resource in furtherance of an investigation or proceeding in another state related to the provision or receipt of reproductive health care services

Assembly Bill No. 311 (Ch. 86, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes hospital to enter into agreement with Armed Forces to authorize unlicensed person who provides care under authority granted by Federal Government to provide such care in the hospital in certain circumstances
- Authorizes similar agreement for surgical technologists
- Exempts persons providing such care from provisions governing licensure and regulation of certain health professionals

Assembly Bill No. 189 (Ch. 91, Stats. 2023)

- If board of county commissioners or governing body of a city in Clark County adopts ordinance restricting hours of construction in a common-interest community, the ordinance must allow construction work in a declarant-controlled common-interest community to begin at, but not earlier than, 5 a.m. during the period from April 1 to September 30
- Prohibits declarant-controlled common-interest community from restricting hours of construction to hours other than hours set by such an ordinance
- Requires any ordinances relating to excessive noise to be subject to the construction hours authorized above

Assembly Bill No. 225 (Ch. 93, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes process for persons not otherwise authorized under existing law (or representative of governmental agency for whom a person is an employee) to petition district court to make the personal information of the person contained in the records of the county recorder, county assessor, county clerk, city clerk or Secretary of State confidential
 - Requires sufficient justification for request for confidentiality
 - Any such order expires 5 years after date of order, but may be extended in 5-year increments

Senate Bill No. 8 (Ch. 101, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 30, 2023

• Designates criminal investigators employed by the Division of Child and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Service as category II peace officers

Senate Bill No. 43 (Ch. 104, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes the Governor to appoint any officer or employee of a city or county, rather than only members of the governing body of a city or county, to the Nevada Commission on Aging within the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services
- Requires the Division to update parts of the plan for persons with disabilities required by the Legislature in 2001 as it determines necessary
- Requires the Nevada Commission on Services for Persons with Disabilities to coordinate with the Statewide Independent Living Council to seek ways to avoid unnecessary duplication of services and establish priorities for the Division in conjunction with the state plan for independent living
- Shortens the title of the Community Advocate for Elder Rights to the Community Advocate
 - Similarly shortens title of Office of the Community Advocate for Elder Rights
- Replaces 5-year strategic plan of goals for services provided by the Division with statewide plan to provide services to persons who are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired

Senate Bill No. 39 (Ch. 107, Stats. 2023)

- Makes records received by the Board on Indigent Defense Services, the Department of Indigent Defense Services or its designee which are protected by the attorney-client privilege confidential
 - Additionally makes confidential records of such entities obtained or compiled during or after an investigation arising from a complaint related to the conduct of an attorney
 - Authorizes communication or cooperation with professional licensing board or other governmental agency investigating a complaint against an attorney
- Maintains attorney-client privilege for material disclosed for the purpose of:
 - Requesting prior approval of a claim for compensation for certain legal expenses;
 - Submitting a claim for compensation of certain legal fees or expenses reasonably incurred by an attorney providing indigent defense services; or
 - Submitting a complaint against an attorney providing indigent defense services

Senate Bill No. 115 (Ch. 111, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 31, 2023

• Authorizes a board of county commissioners to establish, use and operate an in-lieu fee program for compensatory mitigation for losses of aquatic resources resulting from certain activities governed by section 404 of the federal Clean Water Act and enter into a cooperative agreement with a public agency or nonprofit organization for the establishment, use or operation of the in-lieu fee program

Senate Bill No. 129 (Ch. 112, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts a civil action to recover damages for a sexual assault that occurred when the plaintiff was 180 years of age or older from the generally applicable 2-year statute of limitation
 - · Allows such an action to be commenced at any time after the sexual assault occurred
 - Applies this change retroactively to any such act, even if the statute of limitation in effect at the time of the act has expired, which has effect of reviving civil actions that would otherwise be time-barred

Senate Bill No. 85 (Ch. 116, Stats. 2023)

- Increases the holdback on certain highway contracts from 2.5 percent to 5 percent
 - Eliminates requirement for Director of Department of Transportation to perform final inspection
 - Allows release of holdback upon acceptance by Director of satisfactory completion of contract
 - Authorizes Director to resolve dispute on such contracts between contractor and subcontractor or supplier if more than 5 percent of a payment is withheld

Assembly Bill No. 124 (Ch. 129, Stats. 2023)

- Removes requirement for State Board of Osteopathic Medicine to annually request verified evidence of completion of continuing medical education requirements from at least one-third of renewal applicants
 - Board to determine percentage of applicants to audit instead

Assembly Bill No. 17 (Ch. 141, Stats. 2023)

Effective May 31, 2023

 Removes requirement for person convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance to dress in certain distinctive garb while performing community service ordered by a court


Assembly Bill No. 159 (Ch. 144, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits offenders who committed certain offenses relating to cruelty to animals from receiving credits against minimum term imposed by a sentence
 - Prohibits deferral of judgment for such offenses
 - Prohibits early discharge from probation for such offenses
- Establishes maximum period of probation or suspension of sentence for certain offenses relating to cruelty to animals at 60 months

Senate Bill No. 153 (Ch. 146, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Director of Department of Corrections to adopt regulations prescribing standards for supervision, custody, care, security, housing and medical and mental health treatment of offenders who are transgender, gender non-conforming, gender non-binary and intersex
 - Authorizes training in cultural competency regarding such offenders

Assembly Bill No. 330 (Ch. 150, Stats. 2023)



- Revises various provisions relating to discipline of pupils in public schools
 - See AB285 (ch. 149, Stats. 2023)

Assembly Bill No. 60 (Ch. 181, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 2, 2023

- Revises the process for the governing body of a municipality to provide notice of annual assessment roll for a neighborhood improvement project
 - Governing body must annually:
 - Prepare an amendment to the assessment roll and an estimate of expenditures for the next fiscal year;
 - Hold a public meeting to consider the amendment;
 - Mail or transmit by electronic mail a notice of the public meeting at least 21 days before the meeting to the owner of each tract to be assessed; and
 - Confirm the amendment by resolution and mail notice to each such owner
 - Amendment to an assessment roll must be listed on governing body's agenda as a separate item and cannot be approved as part of a group of agenda items in a single motion

Senate Bill No. 172 (Ch. 194, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 5, 2023

• Authorizing a minor to give express consent to certain health care providers for services for the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy

Assembly Bill No. 220 (Ch. 210, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 6, 2023

- Revises various provisions relating to water
 - District boards of health may provide financial incentives to convert from septic to sewer system
 - Revises requirements for a permit to operate a water system
 - Requires board of county commissioners in Clark County to require nearby lots to connect to water system
 - Revises planning requirements relating to water
 - Requires sprinkler equipment to comply with WaterSense requirements
 - Extends prohibition of use of Colorado River water for nonfunctional turf on all property except property used exclusively as a single-family residence
 - Authorizes further restrictions on use of water by single-family residence
 - Requires irrigation water efficiency monitoring program on certain parcels using Colorado River water
 - Prohibits new septic system installation on any parcel using water from Colorado River

Senate Bill No. 391 (Ch. 225, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 7, 2023

- Prohibits local government that has or ever had sundown siren ordinance from sounding a siren, bell or alarm for any purpose other than alerting persons to an emergency, testing not more than once every 6 months or celebrating a legal holiday on the day of the legal holiday
 - Maximum penalty of \$50,000 for each violation

Senate Bill No. 336 (Ch. 229, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 7, 2023

- Exempts practitioners of healing arts who are acting within the scope of their authority from provisions of law governing dentists, nurses, osteopathic physicians and physician assistants, podiatrists and optometrists
- *Requires State Board of Nursing to issue a certificate of registration to practice as a certified registered nurse anesthetist to registered nurses who meet certain requirements and authorizes CRNAs to order, prescribe, possess and administer controlled substances, poisons, dangerous drugs and devices under certain circumstances
 - *Effective January 1, 2024

Assembly Bill No. 140 (Ch. 231, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 7, 2023

Makes Juneteenth Day a legal holiday in Nevada

Senate Bill No. 14 (Ch. 237, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 9, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to gaming

Senate Bill No. 118 (Ch. 239, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 9, 2023

• Authorizes counties that are not physically adjacent to jointly create a health district

Assembly Bill No. 364 (Ch. 258, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 9, 2023

- Increases size of Board of Medical Examiners from 9 to 11 members
 - Additional members are one physician assistant and one practitioner of respiratory care

Assembly Bill No. 454 (Ch. 285, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 10, 2023

- Requires Board on Indigent Defense Services to adopt regulations establishing rates of hourly compensation for attorneys who provide indigent defense services in counties other than Clark and Washoe and attorneys in postconviction habeas corpus cases in all counties
 - Compensation of appointed attorneys are obligation of county unless county has transferred its responsibility for indigent defense or met maximum amount paid for such services set by Board

Senate Bill No. 435 (Ch. 329, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 12, 2023

- Existing law authorizes operators of agencies to provide personal care services and medical facilities to agree, on 2/3 vote of all operators, to impose assessments on themselves and use proceeds for certain purposes
 - Authorizes such money to additionally be used to provide supplemental payments or enhanced rates of reimbursements to certain providers on such a vote
 - Authorizes Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of Department of Health and Human Services to
 use money generated from assessment on hospitals to provide additional supports and services under
 Medicaid for recipients with serious behavioral health conditions
 - Prohibits using more than 15 percent of money generated by assessments for administrative costs or providing supports and services in previous bullet point

Senate Bill No. 412 (Ch. 373, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 12, 2023

- Makes certain offenses involving firearms and home invasions ineligible for early discharge from probation
- Revises definition of "strangulation" for the purposes of crime of battery
- Creates category B felony for use or carry of firearm in relation to certain drug offenses
- Requires warning of nonentry for crime of trespass to have been given within 24 months before entry

Senate Bill No. 242 (Ch. 377, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 12, 2023

• Establishes the Psychedelic Medicines Working Group to study certain issues relating to therapeutic use of entheogens

Senate Bill No. 350 (Ch. 378, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 12, 2023

• Establishes Graduate Medical Education Grant Program in the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in Governor's Office to award competitive grants to create, expand and retain residency and fellowship programs for physicians in Nevada

Senate Bill No. 380 (Ch. 379, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 12, 2023

- Revises, from January 1, 2024, to July 1, 2025, the date on which an agency which provides child welfare services is required to participate in the Extended Young Adult Support Services Program
 - Allows agency to request to participate sooner

Senate Bill No. 291 (Ch. 403, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

• Eliminates requirement for student teacher to complete 4 weeks of student teaching before applying for employment as a substitute teacher

Senate Bill No. 221 (Ch. 406, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 14, 2023

• Requires Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services to establish a specific category of provider for billing and reimbursement under Medicaid for clinics that provide services primarily to children with cancer and rare diseases and billing guidelines and rate methodology for such clinics consistent with prevailing best practices

Senate Bill No. 328 (Ch. 420, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 14, 2023



- Revises various provisions relating to the Cannabis Compliance Board
 - Authorizes Board to seize and destroy cannabis and cannabis products involved in unlicensed activities
 - Revises requirements and qualifications for members of Board and staggers terms
 - Transfers authority to appoint and remove Executive Director from Board to Governor
 - Requires Board to adopt regulations on certain additional subjects
 - Eliminates the exemption of the Board from the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act
 - Authorizes judicial review of disciplinary decisions of Board

Senate Bill No. 54 (Ch. 428, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

- Requires Secretary of State to prepare, maintain and publish an elections procedures manual
 - Requires city and county clerks to comply with most recent version of manual
 - Requires SoS to provide training to certain elections officials related to procedures, and requires such officials to attend

Senate Bill No. 497 (Ch. 432, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

• Authorizes state agency to retain, rather than crediting to the State General Fund, any money received for costs of arbitrating between insurers and providers of health care in "surprise medical billing" cases

Senate Bill No. 378 (Ch. 436, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

- Requires only that certain specified documents concerning certain unit-owners' associations be made available on Internet website or electronic portal of association
- Eliminates requirement for such an association to include ability to make payments on Internet website or electronic portal; instead authorizes such payments if certain requirements are met
- Revises requirements concerning the provision of certain notices by a unit-owners' association

Senate Bill No. 451 (Ch. 439, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

 Directs Joint Interim Standing Committee on Growth and Infrastructure to conduct a study during the 2023-2024 interim concerning certain subjects relating to hydrogen

Senate Bill No. 195 (Ch. 441, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

- Revises provisions relating to disciplinary action against holder of license or registration card issued by Cannabis Compliance Board
- Requires Board to adopt regulations governing transfer of ownership interest in a cannabis establishment
- Revises provisions governing charging and collection of fees by Board
 - Prohibits "time and effort" fees

Senate Bill No. 342 (Ch. 445, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 13, 2023

- Exempts from requirement to complete a practice obligation in a health professional shortage area or area with medical underserved population in Nevada a person who receives a stipend from the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education to participate in a program to earn a degree of doctor of veterinary medicine
- Creates program to fund College of Veterinary Medicine at Utah State University in exchange for stipends for 70 Nevadans to earn DVM

Assembly Bill No. 448 (Ch. 460, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Eliminates exemption from real property transfer tax for certain transfers (including transfers between affiliated business entities) if transfer made to entity formed for the purpose of evading the real property transfer tax

Assembly Bill No. 391 (Ch. 488, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Authorizes local government to enter into prehire agreement for public work which contains a preference for hiring certain local residents for labor on the public work

Assembly Bill No. 399 (Ch. 494, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

Creates Subcommittee on Education Accountability of Interim Finance Committee

Assembly Bill No. 503 (Ch. 498, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

 Revises various provisions relating to background checks for conformity with requirements of Federal Bureau of Investigation

Assembly Bill No. 526 (Ch. 499, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Authorizes various nonprofit organizations, in certain specified amounts, to register with State Treasurer to receive a share of COVID-19 relief money authorized for expenditure but remaining unused by December 31, 2026

Assembly Bill No. 528 (Ch. 501, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Provides matching funds up to \$100,000,000 to qualified projects that are facilities to provide support services to persons and families experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless

Assembly Bill No. 244 (Ch. 503, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Establishes certain rights of person compelled to submit to mental or physical examination pursuant to court order, contractual obligation or other type of obligation

Senate Bill No. 226 (Ch. 520, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

- Requires regulations of Labor Commissioner relating to public works to be consistent with declaration of legislative intent that payment of prevailing wage on public works is essential in several ways to economic well-being of State and that careful scrutiny of new financing structures is necessary to ensure workers are paid prevailing wages
- Authorizes organization to partner with state agency or local government using private money only for construction of hospital, medical education building or medical research building if organization qualifies as a tax-exempt organization and a supporting organization under the Internal Revenue Code
 - Projects of such organizations are subject to payment of prevailing wage, but exempt from certain provisions of existing law relating to award of contracts and involvement of State Public Works Division
 - Imposes certain requirements for subcontracts for such projects
- Moves from legislative declaration to substantive law language regarding use of lease-purchase agreements and installment-purchase agreements and requires projects under such agreements to pay prevailing wage

Senate Bill No. 231 (Ch. 530, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 15, 2023

• Establishes \$250,000,000 matching grant program to fund raises for all public school employees other than administrators

Senate Bill No. 364 (Ch. 533, Stats. 2023)

Effective June 16, 2023

- Requires law enforcement agency to communicate with Indian tribe or notify Office of Historic Preservation of State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources if human remains that are reasonably believed to be native Indian are found
- Requires Office to adopt regulations regarding protection of Indian burial sites and historic and prehistoric sites that incorporate values, beliefs and traditions of Indian tribes of Nevada

Laws effective on July 1, 2023

Senate Bill No. 40 (Ch. 7, Stats. 2023)

- Makes various changes relating to manufactured homes, mobile homes, manufactured buildings or commercial coaches or factory-built housing, including:
 - Changes name of document evidencing ownership of such things from "certificate of ownership" to "certificate of title"
 - Allows issuance of certain related documents in electronic form
 - Eliminates certain requirements relating to dealer's report of sale and acknowledgement of taxes
 - Delegates authority to Administrator of Housing Division to determine what documents must be submitted when such things are sold by someone other than a dealer
- Revises eligibility requirements for use of money from Account for Low-Income Housing to assist with rent at a manufactured home lot to persons whose income is at or below certain federally prescribed levels or a level set by the Administrator of the Housing Division
- Decreases the minimum size of a manufactured home that a zoning ordinance must allow to be placed on a residential lot: (1) from 1,200 to 400 square feet; and (2) to allow such homes consisting of only one section

Senate Bill No. 50 (Ch. 8, Stats. 2023)

- Existing law creates a sales tax holiday for members of the Nevada National Guard on active status and certain relatives of such members on the date on which Nevada Day is observed and the immediately following Saturday and Sunday
- For compliance with the Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement, converts the holiday from an exemption at point of sale to a refund process

Assembly Bill No. 19 (Ch. 11, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes tribal governments to participate in the Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program and receive grants from the Program
- Authorizes an officer or employee of a tribal government who is not a professional engineer or professional land surveyor to be appointed as a state water right surveyor solely for the purpose of work done for a tribal government

Assembly Bill No. 24 (Ch. 12, Stats. 2023)

- Adds two additional members to the Committee on Emergency Medical Services
 - One member, appointed by State Board of Health, who is employed by or volunteers with a local government agency that provides emergency medical services but is not part of a fire-fighting or law enforcement agency
 - One member, appointed by State Board of Health, who is employed by or volunteers with an agency, organization or other operator that provides emergency medical services on tribal land

Assembly Bill No. 40 (Ch. 15, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes the use of electronic communications for certain purposes relating to food establishments, including:
 - The submission of an electronic mail address by an applicant to allow a health authority to communicate with the applicant electronically
 - Furnishing an electronic original food inspection report after an inspection by a health authority
 - Serving an inspection report form and certain notices on a permit holder to an electronic mail address provided by a permit holder

Assembly Bill No. 276 (Ch. 19, Stats. 2023)

- Includes communication between a provider of health care who is providing in-person services to a patient and a provider of health care at a different location within the definition of "telehealth"
- Authorizes provider of health care located at originating site who is conducting a forensic medical examination of an apparent victim of sexual assault or strangulation to use telehealth to connect to an appropriately trained physician, physician assistant or registered nurse at a distant site to obtain instructions and guidance on conducting the examination

Senate Bill No. 3 (Ch. 20, Stats. 2023)

- Adds one additional member to the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security
 - Director of Department of Public Safety or his/her designee

Assembly Bill No. 3 (Ch. 22, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Decreases the frequency of the State Controller's complete financial report of the State Permanent School Fund from quarterly to annually

Assembly Bill No. 21 (Ch. 23, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Makes comprehensive revisions to state laws relating to money transmission to conform to the Model Money Transmission Modernization Act by the Conference of State Bank Supervisors

Assembly Bill No. 36 (Ch. 24, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to veterans
 - Adds the Attorney General, the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Workforce Innovation to the Interagency Council on Veterans Affairs
 - Requires the Department of Veterans Services to report only the number of veterans service officers employed by this State
 - Eliminates the requirement for the Adjutant General to report the total number of members of the Nevada National Guard identified by Military Occupational Specialty and zip code
 - Eliminates the requirement for the Interagency Council on Veterans Affairs to develop and administer a fellowship program
 - Requires biennial reports of Interagency Council on Veterans Affairs and Nevada Veterans Services Commission to be on the basis of fiscal year, rather than calendar year
 - Revises outreach and reporting requirements for the Women Veterans Advisory Committee

Assembly Bill No. 212 (Ch. 28, Stats. 2023)

- Requires the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to establish certain policies and procedures relating to accessibility of transcripts at all NSHE institutions
 - Current and former students must be given access to unofficial transcript at all times, regardless of whether any debt is owed
 - Current and former students must be allowed to obtain official transcript or have official transcript transmitted to a third party, regardless of whether any debt is owed
 - NSHE institutions cannot charge a higher fee for a transcript to a current or former student who owes a debt

Assembly Bill No. 372 (Ch. 30, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit organization, community entity or governmental agency to provide certain educational tools relating to early childhood education to families and caregivers

Assembly Bill No. 18 (Ch. 36, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to the duties and organization of the Division of Enterprise
 Information Technology Services of the Department of Administration

Assembly Bill No. 68 (Ch. 37, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the formula for the assessment charged to counties other than Clark County for the commitment of a child to the custody of a regional facility for the treatment and rehabilitation of children by a juvenile court
 - Existing formula: assessment equals total amount of money budgeted by Legislature for operation of facility, minus money appropriated by Legislature for support of facility, divided by total number of pupils enrolled in public school in State in preceding school year (excluding pupils in an unassessed county), multiplied by number of pupils enrolled in public school in assessed county
 - New formula: total amount of money budgeted by Legislature for operation of facility, minus money appropriated by Legislature for support of facility, equals total assessment amount; 50 percent of assessment amount calculated using existing formula, and 50 percent calculated by dividing by total number of bed days at the facility for the previous 2 fiscal years and multiplying by number of bed days used by assessed county
 - Net effect is to base half of assessment on pupil count and half on usage, rather than all on pupil count

Assembly Bill No. 206 (Ch. 39, Stats. 2023)

- Adds one additional member to the Nevada Commission for Persons Who Are Deaf and Hard of Hearing
 - Required to be registered with Aging and Disability Services Division of Department of Health and Human Services to engage in the practice of sign language interpreting and have experience with and knowledge of interpreting in primary or secondary educational setting and post-secondary educational setting and freelance interpreting

Assembly Bill No. 219 (Ch. 41, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to meetings subject to the Open Meeting Law:
 - Requires a period of public comment for such a meeting which is agendized for more than one day either: (1) at the beginning of each day the meeting is held before any items on which action may be taken are heard and again before the meeting recesses for the day or adjourns; or (2) after each item on the agenda on which action may be taken is discussed by the public body but before action is taken on the item
 - Requires the agenda for such a meeting held using a remote technology system without a physical location where members of the public may attend to include clear and complete instructions for members of the public to call in to the meeting to provide comment
 - If such a meeting has a physical location, allows notice of the meeting to be posted at the building in which the meeting will be held
 - If such a meeting involves consideration of a contested case or a regulation, the meeting may not be held using a remote technology system unless there is also a physical location where members of the public may attend and participate
 - If a meeting is held using a remote technology system, clear and complete instructions for members of the public to call in and provide comment must be read verbally before the first period of the day devoted to public comment

Assembly Bill No. 401 (Ch. 42, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes an approved school of practical or professional nursing to determine the appropriate ratio of faculty members to students for a course that provides clinical training so long as the ratio does not exceed 1 member of the faculty for every 12 students

Senate Bill No. 42 (Ch. 44, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes the use of money in county fund for medical assistance to indigent persons in Clark or Washoe County to: (1) provide enhanced rate of reimbursement to any public hospital in the county for hospital care provided to recipients of Medicaid; and (2) make supplemental payments to any public hospital in the county for provision of such hospital care through increased federal financial participation

Senate Bill No. 44 (Ch. 45, Stats. 2023)

- Moves authority for the State Dental Health Officer from the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services to the Department itself
 - · Officer required to satisfy educational requirements for license as dentist, but not required to hold license
 - Officer allowed to simultaneously have private practice
- Moves authority for the State Public Health Dental Hygienist from the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services to the Department itself
 - Hygienist not required to hold current license to practice dental hygiene
 - Hygienist allowed to simultaneously have private practice
- Moves State Program for Oral Health from Division of Public and Behavioral Health to Department of Health and Human Services
- Moves Advisory Committee on the State Program for Oral Health from Division of Public and Behavioral Health to Department of Health and Human Services

Senate Bill No. 66 (Ch. 46, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits persons convicted of certain offenses from operating a commercial motor vehicle for certain periods of time to conform with federal law
 - · Persons convicted of offenses relating to human trafficking using vehicle are disqualified for life
- Revises certain crimes relating to human trafficking to more closely conform to federal law
- Revises various other provisions relating to commercial motor vehicles to match federal law
 - Prohibitions on employers allowing driver to operate vehicle in certain circumstances
 - Compliance with requirements relating to licenses and learner's permits
 - Furnishing driving record information to US Secretary of Transportation
- Requires driver of commercial motor vehicle who is not required to stop at railroad crossing to: (1) slow and confirm tracks are clear; (2) stop vehicle within a certain distance if tracks are not clear; and (3) obey traffic control device and directions of police officer at crossing

Senate Bill No. 27 (Ch. 47, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies that an emergency, for the purpose of exemption from requirement to notify appropriate association for persons who own, operate or maintain a subsurface installation before engaging in excavation or demolition, includes use of certain equipment and methods to determine severity or spread of underground leak or locating a subsurface installation by operator of subsurface installation in certain circumstances
- Expands the definition of "excavation" for such purposes to include movement or removal of earth, rock or other material in or on the ground using non-mechanical equipment by a contractor or, if the movement or removal occurs more than 12 inches below the surface of the original groundline, by any person

Senate Bill No. 4 (Ch. 48, Stats. 2023)

- Eliminates certain restrictions on the use of money in the Fund for a Healthy Nevada by the Department of Health and Human Services
 - · Allows the Department to use such money in ways other than direct expenditure
 - Allows the use of such money for purposes other than paying for benefits for senior citizens and persons with disabilities
- Authorizes Department to use money in the Fund for a Health Nevada for grants, contracts and agreements to pay for or subsidize the cost of prescription drugs, pharmaceutical services and other benefits for natural persons who are residents of Nevada and meet other criteria established by the Department

Senate Bill No. 13 (Ch. 49, Stats. 2023)

- Updates certain references to federal law relating to pesticides
- Requires employees of local governments or state agencies who engage in pest control to obtain a license from the Director of the State Department of Agriculture
- Requires records of sale or distribution of restricted-use pesticides to be kept at each place of business where such pesticides are sold or distributed

Senate Bill No. 117 (Ch. 50, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services to include in the State Plan for Medicaid coverage for services of community health workers who are supervised by other types of providers of health care

Senate Bill No. 119 (Ch. 51, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023*

- *Extends the requirement for third-party payers (other than industrial insurers) to cover certain services provided through telehealth in the same amount as services provided in person, which would otherwise have expired on May 20, 2023, or June 30, 2023, depending on the kind of services, to July 1, 2023
 - *Effective retroactively on and after May 20, 2023
- Makes such a requirement permanent on and after July 1, 2023, for certain services
 - Services delivered through means other than audio-only interaction to patients at certain originating sites located in rural areas or by certain facilities
 - Counseling or treatment relating to a mental health condition or substance use disorder

Senate Bill No. 18 (Ch. 53, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Reduces the required frequency of meetings for the planning commission of a city, county or region from once per month to once per quarter in all counties other than Clark and Washoe

Senate Bill No. 25 (Ch. 58, Stats. 2023)

- Requires the State Public Works Division of the Department of Administration to implement and maintain a long-term plan that addresses the future need for suitable office spaces for the departments and agencies of the Executive Department of State Government and requires such departments and agencies to cooperate with the Division on a biennial basis in such planning
- Requires the State Public Works Board to consider such a long-term plan when it makes recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature

Senate Bill No. 214 (Ch. 60, Stats. 2023)

- Eliminates the Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics
- Eliminates the Commission on Educational Technology and transfers duties to the Department of Education
- Eliminates the Competency-Based Education Network
- Eliminates the Committee on Anatomical Dissection
- Eliminates the Advisory Committee to the Juvenile Justice Oversight Commission
- Eliminates the advisory group to study the delivery of health care through patient-centered medical homes

Senate Bill No. 437 (Ch. 61, Stats. 2023)

- Revises requirements for the issuance of a certificate as a certified public accountant
- Authorizes waiver of examination requirement for certain experienced candidates
- Authorizes practice in this State by public accounting firms certified in another state under certain conditions
- Exempts entities whose sole business is preparing tax returns and related schedules from the requirement of registration with the Nevada State Board of Accountancy

Assembly Bill No. 110 (Ch. 62, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

- Authorizes a manufacturer or wholesaler to dispense certain dialysate drugs and devices necessary to administer dialysis at a residence to a patient with irreversible renal disease or designee, provider of health care or hospital or facility for the treatment of irreversible renal disease
 - Requires manufacturer or wholesaler to satisfy certain requirements before dispensing, including retaining records in the same manner as a pharmacy, hospital or practitioner
 - Allows use of a third-party logistics provider to deliver such drugs or devices
- Authorizes a person to possess dialysate drugs dispensed to the person by a manufacturer or wholesaler

Assembly Bill No. 100 (Ch. 65, Stats. 2023)

- During the 2023-24 interim, requires the Department of Health and Human Services to develop evidence-based and culturally sensitive assessments to be administered to family caregivers for persons with disabilities or health conditions and implement a pilot program to administer such assessments to such persons.
- Requires the Department to annually report on the progress and results of the pilot program and publish such reports on the Internet website of the Department

Senate Bill No. 286 (Ch. 67, Stats. 2023)

- Requires the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services to provide information relating to multiple sclerosis on a website of the Division
- Requires the Governor to annually proclaim the third week of March as "Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week"

Assembly Bill No. 13 (Ch. 68, Stats. 2023)

- Requires any written appeal from certain alleged violations, reprisals or retaliatory actions taken against a state officer or employee who discloses information concerning improper governmental action to be filed within 60 working days after the alleged violation, reprisal or retaliatory action occurred
- Eliminates the authority of a hearing officer who hears such an appeal to terminate the employment of a person responsible for such a violation, reprisal or retaliatory action

Assembly Bill No. 76 (Ch. 70, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Increases the maximum amount of reasonable fees for expert witnesses that may be awarded to the prevailing party in certain civil actions from \$1,500 each for up to five expert witnesses to \$15,000 each for up to five expert witnesses

Assembly Bill No. 146 (Ch. 75, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies the definition of "cable service" for the purpose of state laws relating to cable service to exclude any video content accessed via a service that enables users to access content, information, electronic mail or other services offered via the Internet
- Clarifies the definition of "video service" for the purpose of state laws relating to video service to mean the provision by a video service provider over a video service network of certain multichannel video programming, excluding certain video content accessed via the Internet (including streaming video content), direct-to-home satellite services and any wireless multichannel video programming provided by a commercial mobile service provider

Assembly Bill No. 164 (Ch. 77, Stats. 2023)

- Eliminates the advisory committee established to assist and advise the Administrator of the Division of Outdoor Recreation of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources on the development and administration of the Outdoor Education and Recreation Grant Program
 - Requires the Advisory Board on Outdoor Recreation to instead fulfill such duties
- Requires the Division to establish an Outdoor Education Advisory Working Group in the 2023-24 interim to study approaches to incorporate outdoor recreation into the curriculum of the public education system

Assembly Bill No. 455 (Ch. 89, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes imposition of civil penalty by Department of Taxation upon a person who violates provisions of existing law resulting in the seizure of counterfeit stamps, contraband tobacco products, machinery or cigarette rolling machines
- Credits such penalties to a separate account in the State General Fund for enforcement of provisions governing contraband tobacco products

Assembly Bill No. 361 (Ch. 97, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes a department, institution or agency that requires the approval of the Interim Finance Committee to accept a grant and revise a work program to implement the grant to request provisional approval from the Interim Finance Committee to accept the grant and revise the work program
 - Requires no further approval from the Interim Finance Committee unless the actual amount of the grant or change exceeds the amount approved plus 10 percent or \$75,000, whichever is less

Assembly Bill No. 424 (Ch. 99, Stats. 2023)

- Requires the issuance of not more than \$13 million in previously authorized general obligation bonds to provide money to carry out certain environmental improvement projects included in the second phase of the Environmental Improvement Program for the Lake Tahoe Basin
 - Additionally authorizes the use of interest accrued on previously issued bonds to carry out environmental improvement projects in the second phase of the Environmental Improvement Program

Senate Bill No. 5 (Ch. 100, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes the use of money in the Emergency Assistance Account in the State General Fund by the Division of Emergency Management in the Office of the Military for payment of actual expenses incurred by the Division for the purpose of emergency management, regardless of whether the Governor or Legislature proclaims that an emergency or disaster exists

Senate Bill No. 29 (Ch. 102, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Prohibits payment of interest on a refund of any tax which was over-collected by a taxpayer and which the taxpayer is required to refund to the person from whom the tax was initially collected

Senate Bill No. 91 (Ch. 105, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes a licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselor who is approved by the Board and has completed certain instruction concerning problem gambling and the supervision of interns to supervise a certified problem gambling counselor intern

Senate Bill No. 177 (Ch. 106, Stats. 2023)

- Codifies into law the existing policies of the Department of Health and Human Services that provide for coverage of any typical or atypical antipsychotic medication or anticonvulsant medication that is not on the list of preferred prescription drugs upon the demonstrated therapeutic failure of one drug on that list to adequately treat the condition of a Medicaid recipient
 - Clarifies that such a requirement applies to health maintenance organizations and other managed care organizations providing coverage to recipients of Medicaid
 - Authorizes Commissioner of Insurance to suspend or revoke certificate of authority of a health maintenance organization or managed care organization that fails to comply with such requirements

Senate Bill No. 59 (Ch. 108, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to vessels

Senate Bill No. 105 (Ch. 110, Stats. 2023)

- Makes the Department of Corrections subject to the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act for the purpose of adopting regulations relating to fiscal policy, correspondence with inmates and visitation with inmates of the Department
 - Allows existing regulations of the Department to remain effective until replaced by new regulations adopted in accordance with the Act

Senate Bill No. 147 (Ch. 113, Stats. 2023)

- If an employer places an employee on nonworking status, makes wages earned and unpaid at the time of placement due and payable immediately
 - Nonworking status includes temporary layoff, but excludes suspension pending investigation, suspension pursuant to disciplinary action, placement on-call for available work or approved leave of absence
 - Failure to pay wages within 3 days after wages become due results in wages continuing to be payable at the same rate from the day the employee was placed on nonworking status until wages are paid or for 30 days, whichever is less

Senate Bill No. 223 (Ch. 118, Stats. 2023)

- Generally requires documents to be recorded in each county in which real property or any part thereof is situated for foreclosure or sale pursuant to trustee's power of sale
- Excludes short-term lease-back after sale of real property from application of Residential Landlord and Tenant Act
- Deems claim of real estate broker to be satisfied when an escrow agent who has reserved a sufficient amount of money from owner's net proceeds and deposited that amount with the district court

Senate Bill No. 257 (Ch. 121, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Requires payroll report and compliance report for persons who receive a partial abatement of certain taxes for the location of certain facilities for renewable energy to be filed with various governmental entities quarterly, rather than annually, during the term of construction of the facility

Senate Bill No. 258 (Ch. 122, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes State Engineer to grant a permit for a temporary change of the place of diversion, manner of use or place of use of water for up to 3 years, rather than 1 year, for a renewable energy generation project
 - Requires State Engineer to give notice of application for such a permit if period requested is for more than 1 year

Senate Bill No. 411 (Ch. 126, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes juvenile court to establish program for treatment of children with autism spectrum disorders who are alleged or adjudicated to have committed delinquent act
- Makes members of Nevada Commission on Autism Spectrum Disorders who represent school districts nonvoting members

Senate Bill No. 316 (Ch. 130, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the contents of the annual report concerning certain cases filed during the previous calendar year for charges of murder or voluntary manslaughter
 - Transfers responsibility for report from Attorney General to Department of Sentencing Policy

Senate Bill No. 351 (Ch. 132, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Director of Department of Corrections to adopt regulations relating to visits and correspondence between offenders and others
 - Prohibits restriction of visits by person convicted of felony unless extenuating circumstances exist
 - Requires certain written notice when prospective visitor is denied

Senate Bill No. 354 (Ch. 133, Stats. 2023)

- Requires justice of the peace who is not licensed or admitted to practice law in Nevada at the time of election or appointment to pass examination prescribed by Nevada Supreme Court within 18 months after taking oath of office
 - Examination must test competency of examinee's knowledge on certain subject matters relating to duties of justice of the peace

Senate Bill No. 381 (Ch. 134, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Prohibits landlord from charging fee to tenant to perform repairs, maintenance or other work which landlord is required to perform to maintain habitability of dwelling unit

Senate Bill No. 382 (Ch. 135, Stats. 2023)

- Eliminates requirement for district court to appoint counsel for child who is adverse party against whom a protection order is sought
- Makes admission, representation or statement in such a proceeding inadmissible in criminal proceeding

Senate Bill No. 397 (Ch. 136, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Exempts certain railroad companies from requirement to join association for operators of subsurface installations and assist in locating and identifying subsurface installations

Senate Bill No. 401 (Ch. 137, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes recovery of punitive damages against person who causes injury by the operation of a motor vehicle after consuming or using alcohol or another substance regardless of whether the person knew he or she would operate the motor vehicle before consuming or using alcohol or another substance

Senate Bill No. 410 (Ch. 138, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises provisions governing background checks of, and resulting adverse actions against, employees of department of juvenile justice services in Clark County


Assembly Bill No. 44 (Ch. 142, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to Department of Veterans Services
 - Changes titles of Deputy Directors
 - Removes requirement to assist certain persons in making claims for adjusted compensation
 - Removes requirement to assign veterans service officer to each volunteer advocate
 - Requires Director to provide volunteer advocates with opportunity to attend training
 - Increases frequency of certain training from semiannual to quarterly and requires training to be offered to representatives of accredited veterans service organizations

Assembly Bill No. 91 (Ch. 143, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts person from requirement to submit application for permit to change the place of diversion of water already appropriated if the person is sinking or boring a replacement well if both original and replacement sites are on public lands
 - Requires replacement to be within 300 feet of original site
 - Requires notification of relevant federal agencies

Assembly Bill No. 285 (Ch. 149, Stats. 2023)



- Revises various provisions relating to discipline of pupils in public schools
 - See also AB330 (ch. 150, Stats. 2023)

Assembly Bill No. 275 (Ch. 154, Stats. 2023)

- Requires a petition to seal all records relating to a conviction resulting from having been sex trafficked to include a statement from the petitioner certifying that fact
 - Prohibits court or agency from charging fees for sealing records in such a circumstance

Assembly Bill No. 291 (Ch. 155, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Establishes that it is not an element of or defense to the crime of obtaining credit and defrauding a person under false representations of wealth that the acts constituting the crime occurred in this State or within a single city, county or local jurisdiction

Assembly Bill No. 407 (Ch. 162, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Prohibits Director of Department of Motor Vehicles from releasing any personal information from the files or records of Department for any purpose relating to the enforcement of immigration laws, except under certain circumstances

Senate Bill No. 292 (Ch. 171, Stats. 2023)

- Treats a principal employed by a school district as an at-will employee for the first 3 years of employment
 - Renders a principal who has completed this probationary period as an at-will employee again if, in 2 consecutive school years, the star rating of the school declines and 50 percent or more of teachers assigned to the school request a transfer
 - Such a principal is subject to nonrenewal of his or her contract on recommendation of the superintendent of the school district

Assembly Bill No. 33 (Ch. 175, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises the authorized investments for money in the State Permanent School Fund, the General Portfolio of the State or local governments and certain administrative entities

Assembly Bill No. 55 (Ch. 179, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions of the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act

Assembly Bill No. 57 (Ch. 180, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes person with lien on a vehicle to, if vehicle fails to sell at public auction, satisfy lien by selling vehicle by private sale to a third-party purchaser in an arm's length transaction
- Authorizes automobile wrecker to sell certain vehicles that possess minor damage
- Creates a lien on an abandoned vehicle towed by a tow car operator
- Repeals provisions authorizing issuance of special license plates to person appointed as honorary consul of a foreign country

Assembly Bill No. 65 (Ch. 182, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits board of trustees of school district from taking action at a meeting after 11:59 p.m. on the day of the meeting
 - Board of trustees required to wait at least 24 hours after originally scheduled time of meeting to act or to schedule the delayed item at a future meeting
- Revises provisions related to investigations of discrimination based on race, bullying or cyber-bullying in a public school
- Changes the date by which a child must be a certain age to enroll in kindergarten or first grade from the first day of school to August 1 of or preceding the school year
 - Eliminates the authority for a parent to decline to enroll a child in school until age 7

Assembly Bill No. 70 (Ch. 183, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the wildlife management activities for which the Department of Wildlife may use certain fees for processing applications for a game tag
 - Removes the requirement to spend at least 80 percent of the application processing fee for the management and control of predatory wildlife

Assembly Bill No. 127 (Ch. 185, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Prohibits an insurer or other person or entity from treating Medicare supplemental policies differently from other policies of insurance for certain purposes relating to the payment of commissions

Assembly Bill No. 175 (Ch. 187, Stats. 2023)

- Increases the size of the board of trustees of the Clark County School District from 7 to 11 members
 - 4 new members are nonvoting and appointed by board of county commissioners and governing body of 3 most populous incorporated cities in the county
 - Nonvoting members have same rights and responsibilities of voting members and must be included in all meetings of board, including closed meetings, but cannot vote for or serve as an officer of the board

Assembly Bill No. 356 (Ch. 190, Stats. 2023)

- Creates the crime of unlawful installation of a mobile tracking device
 - First offense is a misdemeanor, second offense is a gross misdemeanor, and all subsection offenses are category C felonies

Senate Bill No. 109 (Ch. 192, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes coroner or medical examiner to release and authorize removal of part or all of a body in his or her custody for the purpose of transplantation upon the request of a procurement organization if:
 - The part or body is the subject of a valid anatomical gift;
 - Coroner or medical examiner has no evidence of decedent communicating a desire not to make anatomical gift;
 - Procurement organization made reasonable effort to determine whether any other person in a class authorized to make anatomical gift of decedent's body is available; and
 - No person in such a class who is reasonably available objects to making an anatomical gift
- Authorizes procurement organization to petition court to appoint person to make an anatomical gift of a decedent's body in certain circumstances

Assembly Bill No. 52 (Ch. 198, Stats. 2023)

- Makes various changes to the Open Meeting Law, including:
 - Clarifies that no meeting of a public body occurs if members of a public body do not deliberate or take action on a matter over which the public body has power
 - Specifies that nonvoting members of a public body are generally not counted for quorum
 - Reduces necessary quorum and votes to take action for vacancy on public body (unless all electeds)
 - Revises provisions governing notice to person about whom a public body meets to take certain actions
 - Eliminates requirement for member of certain public bodies to disclose opinion of legal counsel in order to reduce the necessary quorum and number of votes necessary to act
 - Exempts from OML consultations, deliberations, hearings or meetings conducted by committees to prepare arguments for certain ballot measures
 - Clarifies that the OML applies to a university foundation and only applies to a library foundation or educational foundation if such foundations otherwise meet the definition of "public body"

Assembly Bill No. 213 (Ch. 200, Stats. 2023)

- Requires annual report of housing element of master plan of certain cities and counties to the Housing Division of the Department of Business and Industry
 - Division required to compile and publish reports on its Internet website
- Deems application concerning land use planning complete if the governing body or its designee fails to comply with the timeline and process required by law
- Requires governing body to publish on Internet website a list of applications relating to land use planning in areas zoned for residential housing
- Authorizes increased residential density for multi-family or multi-story residential development as a measure for maintaining and developing affordable housing
- Applies same deadlines for cities within a county as apply to counties for various planning purposes

Assembly Bill No. 272 (Ch. 203, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Creates the crime of mail theft as a category D felony

Assembly Bill No. 373 (Ch. 205, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies that Attorney General may obtain certain relief for deceptive trade practices
 - · Civil penalty, disgorgement, restitution, recovery of damages as parens patriae
- Increases maximum civil penalty for deceptive trade practice directed at person with disability from \$12,500 to \$15,000 and at a minor or elderly person from \$12,500 to \$25,000
- Increases maximum civil penalty for willful deceptive trade practice from \$5,000 to \$15,000
- Establishes statute of limitations for all deceptive trade practices punishable as felony to 4 years

Assembly Bill No. 54 (Ch. 206, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to education
 - Eliminates requirement to report on pupils receiving free/reduced-price breakfast/lunch
 - Revises process/amount for reimbursement of hospital providing educational services to children
 - Generally replaces requirements relating to attendance with requirements relating to enrollment
 - However, pupils between 7 and 18 still required to attend, not just enroll in, school
 - Revises provisions relating to absences, chronic absenteeism and truancy
 - Authorizes various notices, consents, reports and other documents to be made electronically
 - Repeals provisions excusing attendance for children who reside a certain distance from the nearest public school or who are at least 15 years of age for the purpose of employment or apprenticeship

Senate Bill No. 208 (Ch. 212, Stats. 2023)

- Requires governing bodies to adopt certain ordinances regulating battery-charged fences
 - Generally allowed in rural and nonresidential areas
 - Limits battery to 12V DC
 - Requires surrounding nonelectric fence, limits height and requires warning signs

Senate Bill No. 407 (Ch. 215, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to estates of deceased persons

Assembly Bill No. 465 (Ch. 220, Stats. 2023)

- Revises maximum age for members of the Nevada National Guard to match federal requirements
- Requires Adjutant General and Assistant Adjutants General to be selected from commissioned officers of Nevada National Guard, rather than US Armed Forces

Assembly Bill No. 256 (Ch. 222, Stats. 2023)

- Requires work-based learning programs in public schools to require all participating pupils to complete training on harassment and healthy relationships in the workplace and identifying the signs of certain predatory behavior
- Authorizes exemption by school district of employees of work-based learning site from requirement to undergo fingerprint-based criminal background check in certain circumstances

Senate Bill No. 309 (Ch. 227, Stats. 2023)

- Creates crime of fertility fraud as a category B felony
 - · Additionally treats providing certain false information about assisted reproduction as category C felony
 - Authorizes civil action against perpetrator of fertility fraud within 3 years of discovery
 - Certain violations treated as sexual offense for the purpose of sex offender registration

Assembly Bill No. 62 (Ch. 232, Stats. 2023)

- Expands exemption from property taxes to portions of real property that qualifies as a low-income unit as part of certain qualified low-income housing projects or is financed with federal Housing Trust Fund money and complies with affordability requirements
- Limits exemption for property used for housing for elderly persons or persons with disabilities to only property used for such persons who are very low-income

Senate Bill No. 386 (Ch. 241, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes applicant for license as barber or apprentice who fails to pass examination for licensure to retake the exam without fulfilling any additional requirements within certain time periods or upon completion of certain amounts of further study or practice

Senate Bill No. 349 (Ch. 242, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to document preparation services

Assembly Bill No. 112 (Ch. 246, Stats. 2023)

- Creates the Wildlife Crossings Account in the State General Fund to identify locations and strategies relating to wildlife crossings and prioritize certain areas to fund projects for wildlife crossings
 - Departments of Transportation and Wildlife required to develop, publish and update inventory of needs for wildlife crossings and other features to improve permeability for wildlife, reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions or enhance wildlife activity

Assembly Bill No. 49 (Ch. 249, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to writs of habeas corpus
- Allows electronic service of certain documents in criminal cases

Assembly Bill No. 32 (Ch. 250, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to the Department of Sentencing Policy and the Nevada Sentencing Commission
- Revises various provisions relating to parole and probation

Assembly Bill No. 130 (Ch. 253, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Authorizes grants from the Fund for a Healthy Nevada to fund the operation of certain assisted living facilities

Assembly Bill No. 463 (Ch. 254, Stats. 2023)

- Transfers duties and authority relating to the licensing and regulation of certain child care facilities within the Department of Health and Human Services from the Division of Public and Behavioral Health to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services
- Revises membership of Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council
- Revises requirements for inspection and review of certain facilities

Assembly Bill No. 207 (Ch. 256, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Authorizes public schools to obtain insurance for liability arising from participation of pupil in work-based learning program

Assembly Bill No. 405 (Ch. 257, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes justice court and municipal court to establish program for treatment of mental illness or intellectual disabilities for eligible defendants

Assembly Bill No. 137 (Ch. 259, Stats. 2023)

- Extends provisions of existing law relating to fetal alcohol syndrome to apply to all fetal alcohol spectrum disorders
- Requires Medicaid to cover certain supports and services for recipients with fetal alcohol spectrum disorders
- Treats fetal alcohol spectrum disorders as a developmental disability for the purpose of provisions governing services for persons with certain developmental disabilities

Assembly Bill No. 125 (Ch. 261, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Establishes certain requirements relating to missing or murdered indigenous persons

Assembly Bill No. 84 (Ch. 262, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Requires Administrator of Division of State Parks of State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to provide free annual permits to state parks and recreational areas to members of Indian tribes in Nevada and state residents who have been discharged from the Armed Forces

Assembly Bill No. 72 (Ch. 263, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Creates the Advisory Committee on the Safety and Well-Being of Public School Staff

Assembly Bill No. 50 (Ch. 264, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes Attorney General to investigate and prosecute certain crimes
 - Organized retail theft, counterfeit goods, certain fraud schemes

Assembly Bill No. 16 (Ch. 266, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Increases the annual base salary for justices of the Nevada Supreme Court and judges of the Nevada Court of Appeals each 6th year based on the cumulative percentage increase in the salaries of classified employees in Nevada during the preceding 6 year period

Assembly Bill No. 15 (Ch. 267, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Increases the annual base salary for district judges each 6th year based on the cumulative percentage increase in the salaries of classified employees in Nevada during the preceding 6 year period

Senate Bill No. 167 (Ch. 269, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Prohibits the imposition of a step therapy protocol by insurer for a drug prescribed to treat a psychiatric condition under certain circumstances

Senate Bill No. 145 (Ch. 271, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes Labor Commissioner to collect investigative costs
- Requires communication between various state agencies on issues relating to employee misclassification
- Revises administrative penalties for conduct relating to employee misclassification
- Eliminates the Task Force on Employee Misclassification

Senate Bill No. 71 (Ch. 273, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Includes education support professionals as members of the Nevada State Teacher Recruitment and Retention Task Force and renames the Task Force accordingly

Senate Bill No. 273 (Ch. 277, Stats. 2023)

- Changes name of Nevada State College to Nevada State University
 - Does *not* change status of NSC/NSU still a state college, not a university, for all purposes other than name

Assembly Bill No. 46 (Ch. 279, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes, rather than requires, the Administrator of the Office of Historic Preservation of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to install historical markers
 - Removes final authority of Nevada Historical Society to determine the content of legends on historical markers

Assembly Bill No. 226 (Ch. 281, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits NSHE from charging out-of-state tuition to:
 - Students who completed high school equivalency assessment in Nevada
 - Students who qualify as in-state residents but have certain immigration statuses

Assembly Bill No. 461 (Ch. 283, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Creates position of Chief Administrative Analyst in the Public Employees' Retirement System

Assembly Bill No. 451 (Ch. 286, Stats. 2023)

- Temporarily authorizes compensation for overtime worked by employees in unclassified service of Budget Division of Governor's Office of Finance for work related to preparation of executive budget
- Requires Division of Human Resource Management of Department of Administration to conduct Executive Department compensation survey

Senate Bill No. 448 (Ch. 344, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Redirects proceeds from administrative assessments charged to persons guilty of misdemeanors which previously went to a special account for certain purpose to the State General Fund for unrestricted use

Senate Bill No. 445 (Ch. 345, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes Division of Public and Behavioral Health of Department of Health and Human Services to use money from licensing and penalty fees for emergency medical services personnel to create and maintain an information system containing certain training records
- Eliminates requirement that revenue from permits for ambulances, air ambulances or certain vehicles of fire-fighting agencies revert to the State General Fund at the end of a fiscal year

Senate Bill No. 477 (Ch. 356, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes appointment of Deputy Director of Division of Tourism of Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs
- Creates Fund for Tourism and Cultural Affairs
- Revises membership of Commission on Tourism
- Revises name of Nevada Magazine publication of Division of Tourism to Nevada Magazine and Visitor Guide

Senate Bill No. 499 (Ch. 368, Stats. 2023)

- Existing law creates Endowment Account of State General Fund to carry out duties of State
 Treasurer relating to the Nevada College Savings Program
 - Authorizes money in Endowment Account to be spent to provide the Nevada ABLE Savings Program
 - Such money may be used for costs to administer Nevada ABLE Savings Program and programs for financial education and employ a Deputy of Financial Literacy and Security
 - Increases from 3 percent to 10 percent the maximum amount of money allowed for such costs

Senate Bill No. 315 (Ch. 374, Stats. 2023)

- Prescribes certain rights for persons with disabilities or who are aged and who receive home and community-based services
- Prescribes certain rights for pupils with disabilities enrolled in a public school or receiving services from a provider of special education and receiving transition services through an individualized education program

Senate Bill No. 390 (Ch. 380, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes creation of system for reporting and analysis of certain information on neurodegenerative diseases at Department of Brain Health at UNLV

Senate Bill No. 283 (Ch. 386, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023*

- Requires patient to be diagnosed with life-threatening or severely debilitating disease or condition, rather than terminal condition, before use of individualized investigational treatment or investigational drug, biological product or device and revises various requirements relating to the use of such investigational products
- *Limits fees charged by custodian of health care records for furnishing copy of records
 - Effective October 1, 2023
- *Removes requirement for certain medical debt collection mail to be sent registered or certified
 - Effective October 1, 2023
- *Revises provisions relating to provision of information from records of employer to person injured or disabled as a result of occupational injury or disease
 - Effective October 1, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 400 (Ch. 387, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023*

- Revises various provisions relating to education, including:
 - Creates the Early Childhood Literacy Account and authorizes grants from the account
 - Revises the duties of the Commission on School Funding
 - Requires the Department of Education to provide data or reports necessary for school district reporting
 - Authorizes cities and counties to apply for authorization to sponsor charter schools
 - Authorizes State Public Charter School Money to award money to charter schools for transporation of pupils in certain circumstances if such money is appropriated by Legislature
 - Revises provisions relating to the Teach Nevada Scholarship Program and creates the Nevada Teacher Advancement Scholarship Program
 - *Reinstates provisions of the Read by Grade 3 program that require pupils who do not demonstrate competency in reading to be retained in grade 3
 - *Effective July 1, 2028

Assembly Bill No. 519 (Ch. 393, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Elko County, and authorizes other rural counties, to levy a property tax for school construction
 - Rate can be set between 1 and 25 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation; failure of Elko County to act sets rate at 25 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation
- Creates Fund to Assist Rural School Districts in Financing Capital Improvements
 - Allows grants from Fund to districts who levy tax above

Senate Bill No. 98 (Ch. 399, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Superintendent of Public Instruction to establish and publish metrics of performance for public schools
- Authorizes transfer of money in Education Stabilization Account to State Education Fund to replace money deposited in SEF in error or correct error in application of Pupil-Centered Funding Plan by Department of Education that creates shortfall in SEF
- Revises provisions relating to the members, meetings and duties of the Commission on School Funding

Senate Bill No. 367 (Ch. 408, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies that each firearm possessed by a person prohibited from possessing firearms constitutes a separate criminal violation
- Authorizes juvenile justice agency and juvenile court to release certain information and records for purpose of performing a background check to determine whether person is allowed to purchase or possess a firearm
- Requires court to transmit to Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History certain records relating to court-ordered admission to certain mental health facilities of certain children with an emotional disturbance in custody of an agency which provides child welfare services

Senate Bill No. 425 (Ch. 410, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Creates the Commission on Innovation and Excellence in Education

Senate Bill No. 452 (Ch. 411, Stats. 2023)

- Directs the entirety of the proceeds of the basic tax for governmental services to the State Highway Fund
 - Effect: Eliminates allocation of 25 percent of proceeds to State General Fund

Senate Bill No. 266 (Ch. 412, Stats. 2023)

- Excludes certain portion of entry fees paid to participate in certain contests or tournaments from the gross revenue of certain gaming licensees for the purposes of calculating gaming license fees and triggering certain recordkeeping and auditing requirements
- Revises provisions relating to the designation of gaming enterprise districts
- Revises filing requirements for certain documents relating to gaming operations conducted outside of Nevada

Senate Bill No. 434 (Ch. 413, Stats. 2023)

- Makes substitute teachers eligible to participate and earn service credit in the Public Employees'
 Retirement System
- Creates an additional retirement option in PERS to receive a reduced retirement allowance in exchange for 6 months' worth of allowances being paid to a designated beneficiary upon death
- Requires court granting a divorce to provide an explanation to the parties of any provision in a decree relating to the disposition of retirement benefits

Senate Bill No. 103 (Ch. 415, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the membership, powers and duties of the Nevada Sentencing Commission
 - Establishes the Subcommittee on Misdemeanors of the Commission

Senate Bill No. 235 (Ch. 416, Stats. 2023)

- Revises provisions relating to pretrial release hearings
- Authorizes court to impose additional conditions on release of person under certain circumstances

Assembly Bill No. 150 (Ch. 431, Stats. 2023)

- Revises provisions requiring Board of Regents to grant fee waivers to students who are Native American
 - Authorizes members of Indian tribes or nations located outside of Nevada who satisfy all other requirements, including Nevada residency, to receive waiver
 - Authorizes students who live on tribal land in Nevada for 1 year or who are members or descendants of tribes or nations located at least partially in Nevada to receive waiver
 - Clarifies that waiver applies to any course or program, whether for a degree or not, offered during any academic period, including dual credit courses
 - Removes "last dollar" requirement
 - Effect: allows fee waiver to be applied first, before any federal education benefits

Senate Bill No. 58 (Ch. 433, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes Nevada Supreme Court, within the limits of available money, to employ such persons as the Court deems necessary to provide staff for the Judicial Department and to adopt certain rules and policies and determine the salaries and benefits of such employees

Senate Bill No. 322 (Ch. 434, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Increases the maximum term of imprisonment for reckless driving from 6 years to 10 years if it results in death or substantial bodily harm to another person and involves operating a vehicle at 50 miles per hour or greater over the posted speed limit or in a pedestrian safety zone or school crossing zone

Senate Bill No. 389 (Ch. 437, Stats. 2023)

- Requires preparation and submission of comprehensive biennial report concerning human trafficking in Nevada
- Revises requirements for compensation from Fund for the Compensation of Victims of Crime
- Revises provisions governing the Contingency Account for Victims of Human Trafficking
 - Renames Account as "Account for Victims of Human Trafficking"

Assembly Bill No. 151 (Ch. 438, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Provides for limited issuance of special license plates commemorating the 150th anniversary of the founding of the University of Nevada, Reno

Senate Bill No. 126 (Ch. 440, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises provisions governing the NV Grow Program

Senate Bill No. 234 (Ch. 443, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Establishes pilot program to allow free calls between offenders and their families

Senate Bill No. 24 (Ch. 447, Stats. 2023)

- Extends existence of Office of Small Business Advocacy in Lieutenant Governor's Office until July 1, 2025, and authorizes use of money from State General Fund to employ personnel
- Moves Keep Nevada Working Task Force from Lieutenant Governor's Office to Secretary of State's Office

Senate Bill No. 72 (Ch. 448, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Directs Joint Interim Standing Committee on Education to conduct certain studies during the 2023-2024 interim

Assembly Bill No. 58 (Ch. 449, Stats. 2023)

- Revises membership of Nevada Air Service Development Commission
 - Revises provisions governing grants by Commission from Nevada Air Service Development Fund

Assembly Bill No. 443 (Ch. 451, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Authorizes use of Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship for course of study at institution for which completion of a clinical program located in Nevada is required

Assembly Bill No. 515 (Ch. 452, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Creates Incentivizing Pathways to Teaching Grant Program in Department of Education

Assembly Bill No. 517 (Ch. 454, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Legislative Auditor to conduct performance audits of Clark and Washoe County School Districts and State Public Charter School Authority by August 31, 2026, and at least every 4 years thereafter
 - Authorizes Chair of Interim Finance Committee to request audits of up to three additional school districts

Senate Bill No. 166 (Ch. 459, Stats. 2023)

- Excludes from definition of "supervisory employee" for purposes related to public collective bargaining persons who provide civilian support services to a law enforcement agency and exercise certain duties under a paramilitary command structure
- Requires separate bargaining units for supervisory employees of category I peace officers, supervisory employees of category II peace officers and supervisory employees of category III peace officers

Senate Bill No. 10 (Ch. 463, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to the Nevada State Infrastructure Bank
 - Requires Bank to keep certain information confidential
 - Moves Bank from Department of Transportation to Office of State Treasurer
 - Expands types of projects for which Bank can provide loans

Senate Bill No. 294 (Ch. 464, Stats. 2023)

- Requires dealer to provide locking device with each sale of firearm
- Requires dealer to post notice that unlawful storage of firearm may result in penalties
- Requires certain information be included in plan for responding to crisis, emergency or suicide in public schools
 - · Requires school police officers to receive related training
- Requires Department of Health and Human Services to develop safe firearm storage education campaign

Assembly Bill No. 279 (Ch. 471, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Prohibits charging out-of-state tuition to and waives registration fees for certain students with a parent who is a veteran and was awarded the Purple Heart

Assembly Bill No. 283 (Ch. 475, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Department of Health and Human Services to establish an incentive payment under Medicaid for doula services provided in rural areas
 - Requires Department to submit request to amend State Plan for Medicaid to increase rate of reimbursement for doula services

Assembly Bill No. 261 (Ch. 478, Stats. 2023)

- Requires State Plan for Economic Development to include statement regarding efficient use of water resources
- Requires plans submitted by regional development authorities to include water conservation strategies

Assembly Bill No. 255 (Ch. 480, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Authorizes agency which provides child welfare services to provide financial assistance to family that adopts a child with special needs until child graduates from high school or reaches 19 years of age

Assembly Bill No. 346 (Ch. 484, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Defines the term "adjusted base budget" for purposes of the State Budget Act to include various stated adjustments

Assembly Bill No. 348 (Ch. 485, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Creates the Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program

Assembly Bill No. 378 (Ch. 486, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to collective bargaining by classified employees in the Executive Department
 - Requires negotiation to begin on October 1, rather than November 1, of even-numbered years
 - Requires selection of mediator and arbitrator and reservation of dates for mediation and arbitration before negotiations begin
 - If parties do not reach agreement through mediation, parties to begin arbitration within 10, rather than 21, days after appointment of mediator
 - Requires arbitration to begin by February 15, rather than March 15, of odd-numbered year

Assembly Bill No. 428 (Ch. 491, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Governor's Office of Workforce Innovation to establish and administer Career Pathways Demonstration Program targeting K-12 education and up to 2 other industries
- Requires Superintendent of Public Instruction to develop strategic plan for recruitment of teachers and other licensed educational personnel
- Requires Clark County School District and allows other school districts to offer a Teacher Academy College Pathway Program at high schools
 - Requires State Treasurer to establish program for reimbursement of tuition for persons who completed Program and worked full-time as a licensed teacher in Nevada for 3 consecutive years
- Revises provisions relating to Commission on Professional Standards in Education
- Allows requirements for course work in parental involvement and family engagement and multicultural education to instead be satisfied by professional development training

Assembly Bill No. 422 (Ch. 492, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Requires Aging and Disability Services Division of Department of Health and Human Services to create pilot program to serve children diagnosed with a fetal alcohol spectrum disorder under certain circumstances

Assembly Bill No. 523 (Ch. 496, Stats. 2023)

- Includes certain sources of revenue in the State Education Fund
- Authorizes temporary advance from Education Stabilization Account or State General Fund to State Education Fund in certain circumstances
- Changes rate of inflation for purpose of determining statewide base per pupil funding amount to be average percentage increase or decrease in CPI during preceding 3 calendar years

Assembly Bill No. 518 (Ch. 497, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to indigent defense

Assembly Bill No. 119 (Ch. 502, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

Creates Vulnerable Adult Fatality Review Committee

Assembly Bill No. 245 (Ch. 504, Stats. 2023)

- Replaces term "sexual misconduct" with "power-based violence"
- Revises various provisions relating to responses to power-based violence in public schools and NSHE institutions

Assembly Bill No. 239 (Ch. 507, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises provisions relating to membership and duties of various state entities upon recommendation of Sunset Subcommittee of Legislative Commission

Assembly Bill No. 192 (Ch. 511, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various requirements relating to elections
 - Establishes requirements for purchase of ballots and return envelopes
 - Revises requirements relating to electioneering
 - Revises provisions relating to recounts and contests of presidential elections
 - Revises provisions relating to risk-limiting audits
 - Revises provisions relating to tampering or interfering with election equipment or computer programs
 - Delays effective date of certain provisions relating to automatic voter registration

Assembly Bill No. 195 (Ch. 512, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Department of Motor Vehicles to waive fee for administration of driver's license exam for certain persons released from prison
 - Requires Department to waive late fees for delay resulting from incarceration
 - Requires Department to reinstate free of charge or provide original or renewal driver's license or ID card to certain persons released from prison

Assembly Bill No. 77 (Ch. 514, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Creates Office of Entrepreneurship within Office of Economic Development

Assembly Bill No. 252 (Ch. 515, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

 Revises various provisions relating to the Division of Museums and History of the Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs and access to the institutions thereof

Assembly Bill No. 232 (Ch. 516, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Revises tax on premium cigars set by existing law at 30 percent of wholesale price to have a minimum tax of 30 cents and maximum tax of 50 cents on each premium cigar

Senate Bill No. 240 (Ch. 517, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes investments to be made in impact qualified community development entities in exchange for certain tax credits
- Authorizes an additional \$170,000,000 in qualified equity investments to be made in qualified community development entities and \$30,000,000 in impact qualified community development entities in exchange for tax credits

Senate Bill No. 9 (Ch. 518, Stats. 2023)

- Extends deadline for creation and posting of reports of educational spending, personnel employed and services provided by a school district or public school from October 1 to January 1 of each year
- Authorizes use of 20 percent, rather than 7.5 percent, of certain money appropriated for career and technical education to be used for certain leadership and training activities
- Eliminates all remaining provisions establishing end-of-course finals in public schools
- Replaces requirement of Department of Education to prescribe a form relating to educational involvement accords with requirement that Department ensure public schools comply with certain federal and state policies

Senate Bill No. 450 (Ch. 531, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2023

• Establishes program for relocation of persons residing in single-family residences in the Windsor Park neighborhood of City of North Las Vegas

Senate Bill No. 431 (Ch. 532, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to governmental administration
 - Revises duties of Chief Information Officer
 - Creates Chief Innovation Officer
 - Creates Office of Nevada Boards, Commissions and Councils Standards in Dep't of B&I
 - Renames Personnel Commission and Personnel System to Human Resources Comm'n and System and replaces term "personnel" with "human resources" throughout provisions of NRS relating to System
 - Requires Administrator of Division of Human Resource Management of Dep't of Administration to develop audit function and certain centralized employment systems
 - Replaces req't for competitive examination for classified service with evaluation by appointing authority
 - Replaces registers of persons for appointment to classified service with pools of eligible persons
 - Delegates various employment functions from DHRM to appointing authorities for classified service
 - Increases cap on Rainy Day Fund from 20 percent to 26 percent of total appropriations

Laws effective on October 1, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 2 (Ch. 10, Stats. 2023)

- Allows local governments and contractors of the Department of Transportation or a local government, in addition to the Department itself, to operate vehicles equipped with nonflashing blue lights for certain purposes relating to construction or traffic safety
- Requires drivers to slow down, be prepared to stop and, if possible, change lanes away from such a vehicle when the nonflashing blue lights are active

Assembly Bill No. 47 (Ch. 25, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Allows a governmental entity to construct a trail for use by off-highway vehicles that is adjacent to or near a highway

Senate Bill No. 37 (Ch. 32, Stats. 2023)

- Requires a government attorney who represents an indigent person in a proceeding to ensure that his or her professional conduct complies with the Nevada Rules of Professional Conduct
- Authorizes a government attorney to serve as a third-party mediator in similar circumstances to when a government attorney may represent an indigent person in a proceeding

Senate Bill No. 55 (Ch. 33, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to justice courts
 - Changes the title of deputy clerk for justice court to "clerk of the court" and revises manner of appointment
 - · Eliminates jurisdiction of justice of the peace over adjacent counties for arrest made by Highway Patrol
 - Revises the circumstances in which a case may or must be transferred from a justice court
- Requires a credit of at least the state minimum wage toward the payment of any fine imposed against a person ordered to perform community service.

Senate Bill No. 62 (Ch. 34, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies that, if a judge is licensed to practice law in Nevada:
 - The State Bar of Nevada has exclusive jurisdiction over disciplinary action for acts or omissions that occurred before the date on which the judge entered upon the duties of office
 - The Commission on Judicial Discipline has exclusive jurisdiction over public censure, removal, involuntary retirement and other discipline imposed on or after the date on which the judge entered upon the duties of office

Senate Bill No. 22 (Ch. 56, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes the additional publication on the Internet website of a newspaper of a legal notice or advertisement which is required to be published in a newspaper
 - Clarifies that a change in the Internet address of the website of a newspaper does not break or affect the continuity of such publication
 - Deems an error, temporary Internet website outage or service interruption that prevents the posting or display of such publication to be harmless
 - Renders any legal notice or advertisement published on an Internet website of a newspaper which violates the law relating to such publications is void

Senate Bill No. 87 (Ch. 59, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Authorizes an appointing authority in Executive Department of State Government to fill a position in the classified service without competition if a person meets the minimum requirements for the position and has successfully completed at least 900 hours of service in an AmeriCorps, Youth Conservation Corps or Job Corps program in this State which was related to the position within 2 years before applying for the position

Assembly Bill No. 116 (Ch. 63, Stats. 2023)

- Requires a provider of health care or other services or midwife who provides prenatal care or pediatric care to provide certain information concerning Down syndrome and support services to: (1) a person who is pregnant, has received a positive result from a prenatal test for Down syndrome and requests such information; and (2) the parent or guardian of a child with Down syndrome
- Requires such a provider or midwife to make a referral to appropriate support services when necessary
- Requires the Department of Health and Human Services to maintain an Internet website with a list of such support services available in different areas of the State

Assembly Bill No. 214 (Ch. 78, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes a regional transportation commission to establish a fine for a passenger who refuses to comply with a regional or statewide health and safety standards or mandate
- Requires a regional transportation commission or contractor who operates a public transit system to maintain certain recordings and provide such recordings to an employee organization upon request
- Requires the regional transportation commission in Washoe County to establish an advisory committee
 - Revises the composition of such an advisory committee and authorizes a regional transportation commission to assign certain duties of an advisory committee to another committee established by the commission

Senate Bill No. 264 (Ch. 79, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Allows a civilian employee of a metropolitan police department to be a member of an employee organization only if such an organization is composed exclusively of civilian employees of a metropolitan police department

Assembly Bill No. 316 (Ch. 80, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the penalty for keeping more than two unregistered vehicles on real property if the vehicles are no longer intended for or in condition for lawful use on the highway from a misdemeanor to a civil penalty of not more than \$100 for each day of violation
- Authorizes a local authority to establish an ordinance prohibiting the same conduct and imposing a different, non-criminal penalty in lieu of the civil penalty imposed above

Assembly Bill No. 101 (Ch. 83, Stats. 2023)

- Requires a prosecuting attorney who intends to use testimony provided by an informant at trial to disclose certain information and materials to a defendant as soon as is practicable and no later than 30 days before a trial
 - Allows a court to limit such disclosure to a defendant's attorney in certain circumstances
- Requires a court to instruct the jury to consider certain information in assessing the credibility of an informant
- Requires each office of a prosecuting attorney to maintain complete and systematic records of cases in which testimony by an informant was used
 - Deems such records to be confidential and not public records

Assembly Bill No. 227 (Ch. 94, Stats. 2023)

- Creates a summary procedure for an annulment similar to the summary procedure for divorce when certain factors are present and both spouses agree to the procedure
- Creates a summary procedure for child custody when parents or legal guardians have reached a detailed agreement and court determines that summary procedure is in best interest of child

Assembly Bill No. 333 (Ch. 96, Stats. 2023)

- Requires each housing authority to conduct inspection of each dwelling unit owned or managed by the housing authority and any dwelling unit leased pursuant to certain federal law
 - · Requires collection of signature of tenant to confirm inspection was conducted
 - Requires housing authority to ensure all necessary repairs are made as soon as practicable after inspection
- Exempts a regional housing authority and the commissioners of a regional housing authority from the application of the Local Government Budget and Finance Act

Senate Bill No. 32 (Ch. 103, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts from requirements of existing law governing licensure and regulation of private investigators and related professions by the Private Investigator's Licensing Board any person or employee thereof who is engaged exclusively in the business of transporting persons:
 - From this State to another state, from another state to this State, or through this State for the purpose of a temporary transfer of custody pursuant to the Agreement on Detainers or extradition pursuant to the Uniform Criminal Extradition Act; or
 - Within this State for the purpose of a temporary or permanent transfer of custody of a person from one state or local governmental agency to another

Senate Bill No. 260 (Ch. 109, Stats. 2023)

- Requires a senior living community referral agency to disclose certain information to a person who is aged or the representative of such a person and obtain the consent of the person or representative before making a referral
 - Requires agency to maintain records of disclosures and consents for at least 3 years
- Prohibits senior living community referral agency from engaging in certain acts

Senate Bill No. 164 (Ch. 114, Stats. 2023)

- Redirects fees collected for special license plates indicating support for the Divine Nine in excess of other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Inter-Alumni Council of the United Negro College Fund
 - Divine Nine is a group of historically Black collegiate fraternities and sororities

Senate Bill No. 181 (Ch. 115, Stats. 2023)

- Existing law requires the approval of the Office of Economic Development for an entity seeking a partial tax abatement of certain taxes. Existing law deems the Office to have approved a partial tax abatement upon approval of the Board of Economic Development if the projected value to a single entity is \$250,000 or more or Executive Director of the Office if the projected value is less than \$250,000
 - Increases these thresholds to allow the Executive Director to approve partial tax abatements up to a projected value of \$500,000 and the Board to approve partial tax abatements of \$500,000 or more

Senate Bill No. 182 (Ch. 117, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts certain manufacturers of fully autonomous vehicles from franchise sales and repair requirements
- Allows manufacturer of fully autonomous vehicles to operate own vehicles to provide delivery services without certificate of title

Senate Bill No. 243 (Ch. 119, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes crimes for theft, possession or certain purchases of a catalytic converter
- Prohibits licensed scrap metal processor from purchasing or receiving used catalytic converter from certain persons
 - Requires processor to maintain certain documentation of such for at least 2 years and submit certain information to law enforcement
 - Establishes requirements for payments by processor for purchase of a used catalytic converter

Senate Bill No. 247 (Ch. 120, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes, rather than requires, establishment of regional planning coalition in Clark County
 - Makes various duties of such a coalition contingent on its existence

Senate Bill No. 259 (Ch. 123, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes all wineries with a wine-maker's license to sell its wine at retail or serve by the glass at one location in addition to its premises
- Increases sale limit for certain wineries from 1,000 to 2,000 cases per year and authorizes sale of up to 150 barrels of cider
- Authorizes State Board of Agriculture to create certification for wine produced, blended or aged from fruit grown or honey produced in Nevada
- Revises provisions governing citation of certain alcohol-related businesses

Senate Bill No. 261 (Ch. 124, Stats. 2023)

- Imposes several additional requirements relating to determination of business impact for ordinances of local governments
- Renders rules adopted by local governments void if governing body fails to determine whether a
 petition objecting to rule has merit or take action to readopt or amend a rule to which a business
 has objected

Assembly Bill No. 107 (Ch. 127, Stats. 2023)

- Codifies existing requirement in regulation that a pharmacist employed by an off-site pharmaceutical service provide to provide certain services must be registered to practice in Nevada
- Revises provisions relating to pharmacies located outside of Nevada
 - Such pharmacy that markets to Nevada but does not actually dispense to patients in Nevada exempted from certain requirements
 - Such pharmacy that dispenses to patients in Nevada must include certain information in application for issuance or renewal of license

Assembly Bill No. 120 (Ch. 128, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Allows providers of health care who were initially licensed within the immediately preceding 3 years to provide voluntary health care service in this State in association with a sponsoring organization

Senate Bill No. 338 (Ch. 131, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the definition of "large all-terrain vehicle" for the purpose of laws regulating offhighway vehicles to eliminate the requirement for such a vehicle to have seating capacity for at least 4 people or a truck bed
 - Result is that "large all-terrain vehicle" is any all-terrain vehicle with seating for at least 2 people abreast

Senate Bill No. 415 (Ch. 140, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes a juvenile court to place a child on probation under certain circumstances
 - Period of probation limited to not more than 18 months with certain exceptions
 - Authorizes extensions of period of probation, not to exceed 6 months each
 - Prohibits total period from exceeding 36 months
 - Establishes requirements for hearing to extend probation

Assembly Bill No. 177 (Ch. 152, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Requires State Demographer to provide the fiscal year-end parcel dataset of a county to an association for operators of subsurface installations upon written request

Assembly Bill No. 183 (Ch. 153, Stats. 2023)

- Requires certain entities in the juvenile justice system and the child welfare system to screen certain children for commercial sexual exploitation
 - Requires such entities to take certain actions to protect the safety of children based on such screenings

Assembly Bill No. 350 (Ch. 157, Stats. 2023)

- Requires each law enforcement agency to include certain additional information relating to seizures and forfeitures in the report that the agency submits annually to the Attorney General
 - Requires report of Attorney General containing such information to be in machine-readable format

Senate Bill No. 113 (Ch. 159, Stats. 2023)

- Requires State Engineer to affirm or modify perennial yield of a basin in a designated critical management area
- Revises provisions relating to groundwater management plans

Senate Bill No. 159 (Ch. 160, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Requires Director of State Department of Agriculture to adopt regulations authorizing person to train as an applicator to engage in pest control activities for a period of not less than 90 days without holding a license as an applicator

Senate Bill No. 146 (Ch. 163, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes certified nurse-midwife to perform physical examination and obtain medical history before or after a patient is admitted to a hospital for purpose of giving birth
- Prohibits health carrier from denying request from provider of health care to enter into a provider network contract to join the network established by the health carrier if the provider of health care:
 - Meets and accepts the terms and conditions for participation;
 - Is employed by or has accepted offer of employment at school of medicine or osteopathic medicine in Nevada;
 - Does not have a clinical practice already established in Nevada; and
 - Requests to become a participating provider of health care

Senate Bill No. 192 (Ch. 164, Stats. 2023)

- Renames "hospital advisory board" to "hospital governing board" and requires board to adopt bylaws and related policies and procedures for public hospital
- Authorizes board of hospital trustees of a county hospital or hospital governing board to hold a closed meeting in certain circumstances
 - Makes records of closed meetings public after 5 years
- Authorizes board of hospital trustees or hospital governing board to employ dentists

Senate Bill No. 249 (Ch. 165, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to the practice of cosmetology

Senate Bill No. 269 (Ch. 166, Stats. 2023)

- Decreases the amount of time a dog can be restrained in a 24-hour period from 14 to 10 hours
 - Applies similar restriction to dogs being kept in a boarding facility
 - Allows restraint of dog being processed into an animal shelter

Senate Bill No. 280 (Ch. 167, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Requires a hospital, upon request of a patient giving birth, to provide for insertion or injection of long-acting reversible contraception in certain circumstances
 - Requires notification of religious objections and referral to willing provider of health care
 - Limits the amount that a third party insurer may be charged for such contraception
- *Prohibits an insurer from refusing to cover insertion or injection of such contraception immediately after an insured gives birth
 - *Effective January 1, 2024

Senate Bill No. 289 (Ch. 168, Stats. 2023)

- Existing law provides certain enhanced penalties for persons who commit certain assaults or batteries against a provider of health care in the performance of his or her duties
 - Includes as provider of health care for the imposition of such enhanced penalties a behavior analyst, assistant behavior analyst, registered behavior technician, mental health technician, public safety officer at a health care facility, participant in a program of training to provide emergency medical services, person who provides health care services in the home for compensation or certain other persons employed by or volunteering at a health care facility
 - Enhanced penalties apply any time the provider of health care is assaulted or battered on the premises of the health care facility where the provider performs his or her duty and the perpetrator knows or should know that the provider is a provider

Assembly Bill No. 309 (Ch. 172, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to common-interest communities

Assembly Bill No. 22 (Ch. 174, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises the provisions governing the actions that the State Contractors' Board is authorized or required to take after the issuance of a cease and desist order for unlicensed activity

Assembly Bill No. 34 (Ch. 176, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises the notice requirements for certain applications relating to water and the requirements for maps relating to water rights

Assembly Bill No. 39 (Ch. 178, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes requirements for residential contractor performing construction, remodeling, repair or improvement on a completed and occupied single-family residence similar to requirements on a contract for residential photovoltaic systems or residential pools or spas
 - Limits down payment for such a contract and requires contractor to furnish copy of documents and receipt for any money paid and to apply for and obtain all necessary permits
 - · Contract not containing required elements is voidable by owner

Assembly Bill No. 121 (Ch. 184, Stats. 2023)

- Generally requires the Department of Corrections to provide offenders with the original, physical copy of any physical mail addressed to the offender that the offender is entitled and allowed to receive
- Requires Department to ensure offenders complete a medical release of information form at the time of intake and have ability to update form as necessary
 - If offender is hospitalized for or diagnosed with critical medical condition, Department must attempt to notify persons identified on form within 24 hours after hospitalization or diagnosis and provide offender opportunity to make phone call about health status within 4 hours after returning to institution or facility
- Requires Department to ensure prescriptions are filled in timely manner for offender who requires prescription medication

Assembly Bill No. 191 (Ch. 188, Stats. 2023)

- Excludes a public or private entity that has less than 15 service connections from the definition of "supplier of water"
 - Effect: removes requirement for such an entity to adopt and update a plan of water conservation, conduct a water loss audit or calculate water losses or adopt a plan to provide certain incentives relating to water conservation

Senate Bill No. 418 (Ch. 189, Stats. 2023)

- Requires person seeking to be a candidate for judicial office who is not the incumbent to complete and file with declaration of candidacy a questionnaire prescribed by the Nevada Supreme Court
 - Authorizes an incumbent to complete such a questionnaire
 - Requires filing officer, upon receipt of questionnaire, to publish on Internet website of filing officer

Assembly Bill No. 398 (Ch. 191, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits insurer from issuing or renewing a policy of liability insurance that contains a provision reducing the limit of liability stated in the policy by the costs of defense, legal costs and fees and other expenses for claims or otherwise limits the availability of coverage for such costs
 - Applies prospectively to contracts issued or renewed on or after October 1, 2023

Assembly Bill No. 143 (Ch. 195, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes board of county commissioners of Esmeralda, Eureka or Storey County to convey, without consideration and without complying with certain requirements in existing law, real property that the county acquired directly from the Federal Government for the purpose of clearing title to the property
 - Effect: such property is not subject to real property transfer tax
 - If power used, report to Joint Interim Standing Committee on Government Affairs required
 - Authority expires on June 30, 2025

Assembly Bill No. 23 (Ch. 196, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

Revising various provisions relating to citations issued by the State Contractors' Board

Assembly Bill No. 114 (Ch. 197, Stats. 2023)

- Adds several members to the Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council
- Defines, for the purposes of the Council, "early childhood program" to mean any program for children less than 8 years of age pertaining to nutrition, health care, mental and behavioral health, protection and play and learning to stimulate physical, cognitive, linguistic, social and emotional development

Assembly Bill No. 132 (Ch. 199, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Requires board of county commissioners of Clark County to establish a Regional Opioid Task Force

Assembly Bill No. 262 (Ch. 204, Stats. 2023)

- Creates state purchasing preference for:
 - · Vehicles that minimize emissions and the total cost of the vehicle over the service life of the vehicle; and
 - Motor vehicle fuel blended with ethanol and diesel fuel containing at least 20 percent biodiesel
- Establishes policy goal for all publicly-owned vehicles to emit zero tailpipe emissions by 2050

Assembly Bill No. 408 (Ch. 211, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes towing of vehicle if driver cited for reckless driving
- Prohibits trick driving on premises to which the public has access
- Requires tow car operators to consider charging lower rate for persons unable to pay
- Prohibits certain solicitations of tort victims

Senate Bill No. 34 (Ch. 213, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes Attorney General or chief legal officer or other authorized representative of political subdivision to represent certain officers or employees of the State or political subdivision upon person's request and if representation is in best interest of the State
- Authorizes person in Executive Department to employ counsel other than the Attorney General if the AG determines representation by AG is impracticable, uneconomical or could be conflict of interest

Assembly Bill No. 75 (Ch. 216, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts certain transactions involving securities sold to a Nevada certified investor from certain state registration requirements
 - "Nevada certified investor" is natural person or married couple who generally has a certain minimum level of income

Assembly Bill No. 202 (Ch. 221, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Authorizes patient in certain residential facilities to request installation and use of electronic communication device in patient's living quarters

Assembly Bill No. 415 (Ch. 223, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Revises various provisions relating to dispensing opticians and the Board of Dispensing Opticians

Senate Bill No. 61 (Ch. 224, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Eliminates being signatory on joint account as stand-alone defense to crime of exploitation of older or vulnerable person

Assembly Bill No. 432 (Ch. 230, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to the practice of optometry

Senate Bill No. 417 (Ch. 234, Stats. 2023)

- Increases from \$10/hr to \$25/hr the maximum amount a unit-owners' association can charge for reviewing records of association
- Increases from \$1,000 to \$10,000 the maximum fine for filing a false or fraudulent affidavit for violations relating to common-interest communities
- Authorizes Commission for Common-Interest Communities and Condominium Hotels to designate person as vexatious affiant

Senate Bill No. 436 (Ch. 240, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Requires the Commissioner on Insurance to report annually to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Commerce and Labor on the service contract provider industry in Nevada

Assembly Bill No. 51 (Ch. 248, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the time period within which a police officer is required to or may arrest a person suspected of committing a battery which constitutes domestic violence
- Expands the persons to whom the victim's advocate privilege applies

Senate Bill No. 155 (Ch. 270, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Authorizes certain diversionary and specialty court programs for homeless persons who commit certain misdemeanor offenses

Senate Bill No. 107 (Ch. 272, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Requires Department of Transportation to establish program to allow contractors on highway projects to obtain a permit to use certain law enforcement vehicles

Senate Bill No. 36 (Ch. 275, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Requires Division of Parole and Probation of Department of Public Safety to make a presentence investigation and report to the court that includes a psychosexual evaluation in certain circumstances and to arrange for a psychosexual evaluation of the defendant on joint request of defendant and prosecuting attorney

Assembly Bill No. 135 (Ch. 280, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes homeless person seeking birth certificate to submit signed statement under penalty of perjury that the person is homeless, rather than signed affidavit, and prohibits entity providing birth certificate from requiring such statement to be notarized
- Requires entities providing birth certificates to notify applicants when required documents are missing from application for copy of birth certificate and allow homeless applicants at least 30 days to submit missing documents
- Requires public schools to include 988 hotline information on pupil ID cards
- Requires Nevada Housing Crisis Response System to collaborate with Department of Motor Vehicles to assist certain persons in obtaining ID card

Assembly Bill No. 462 (Ch. 282, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Requires Chair of State Board of Parole Commissioners to appoint an Executive Director and delegate certain powers and duties to Executive Director

Assembly Bill No. 457 (Ch. 284, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Eliminates requirement for Department of Motor Vehicles to automatically reissue certain license plates every 8 years

Senate Bill No. 449 (Ch. 343, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes Commissioner of Consumer Affairs of Consumer Affairs Unit of Department of Business and Industry to adopt regulations relating to structured settlement purchase companies
- Establishes fees for registration of structured settlement purchase companies

Senate Bill No. 134 (Ch. 381, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits insurer from entering into contract with provider of vision care that authorizes insurer to set or limit amount charged by provider for care not reimbursed under contract or requires provider to use a specific laboratory for manufacture of ophthalmic devices or materials
- Requires provider of vision care to disclose to covered person any ownership or pecuniary interest of provider in a supplier of ophthalmic devices or materials before covered person authorizes provider to obtain covered eyewear materials from supplier

Assembly Bill No. 155 (Ch. 388, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Requires policies of health insurance to include coverage of biomarker testing for the diagnosis, treatment, appropriate management and ongoing monitoring of cancer in certain circumstances

Assembly Bill No. 158 (Ch. 391, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Ratifies the Recognition of Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact

Assembly Bill No. 148 (Ch. 397, Stats. 2023)

- Revises provisions relating to child welfare
 - Provides for appointment of guardian ad litem for incapacitated parent or other person responsible for welfare of a child in certain child welfare proceedings
 - Prescribes procedure for judicial review of placement of a child in custody of an agency which provides child welfare services in a qualified residential treatment program
 - Revises procedures governing court-ordered admission of child in custody of an agency which provides child welfare services who has an emotional disturbance to certain psychiatric facilities and the release of such a child from such a facility

Senate Bill No. 331 (Ch. 405, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Requires emergency management plan of Governor or political subdivision to designate at least one shelter for persons with pets and provide for evacuation, transport and shelter of pets

Senate Bill No. 387 (Ch. 409, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Requires Administrator of Division of Human Resource Management of the Department of Administration to periodically review positions in classified service that require a bachelor's degree and revise qualifications to allow substitution of equivalent experience or skills where appropriate

Senate Bill No. 38 (Ch. 414, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Creates a category C felony for a person in a position of authority communicating with a pupil with the intent to engage in certain prohibited acts or encourage the pupil to engage in certain sexual conduct

Senate Bill No. 416 (Ch. 417, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Director of Department of Corrections to adopt regulations governing the operation of a commissary in an institution or facility
 - Authorizes regulations governing possession of personal property by offenders
- Revises provisions relating to deduction of certain costs from offender's account or wages earned

Senate Bill No. 321 (Ch. 418, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits law enforcement agency from using evidence taken from sexual assault forensic evidence kit to prosecute survivor for any crime, as basis to seek further evidence of any crime by survivor or for any purpose other than investigation or prosecution of sexual assault
- Prohibits law enforcement agency, with limited exceptions, from sharing biological evidence of a survivor secured in connection with investigation of sexual assault or including DNA profile of survivor in a database of DNA profiles
- Requires audit of certain biological specimens and DNA profiles by Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History, State DNA Database and forensic laboratories

Senate Bill No. 327 (Ch. 419, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises provisions relating to establishment of polling place, ballot drop box and temporary branch polling place for early voting within an Indian reservation or Indian colony for an election

Senate Bill No. 225 (Ch. 422, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to peace officers
 - Requires certain additional contents of application for certification as peace officer
 - Requires law enforcement agency to provide certain notice and information concerning peace officers employed by agency to Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission
 - Prohibits law enforcement agency from requiring peace officer to make certain attestations relating to cannabis as condition for employment
 - Prescribes requirements for certain standards and disqualifying certain persons from serving as peace officers
 - Requires Director of Commission to report certain information to the National Decertification Index of the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training

Assembly Bill No. 37 (Ch. 424, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

 Authorizes establishment of Behavioral Health Workforce Development Center at one or more NSHE institutions

Senate Bill No. 428 (Ch. 425, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Refers to the voters of Nevada at a general election the question of whether diapers should be exempted from sales and use taxes
 - *Amendments to Sales and Use Tax Act of 1955 can only happen by voter approval, so exemption becomes effective only if approved by voters in November, 2024; exemption would be effective from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2050

Senate Bill No. 106 (Ch. 426, Stats. 2023)

- Exempts the sale of prescription eyewear to intended wearers outside of Nevada from provisions regulating ophthalmic dispensing under certain circumstances
 - Authorizes imposition of administrative action and injunctive relief for certain violations

Senate Bill No. 57 (Ch. 429, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to insurance

Senate Bill No. 362 (Ch. 435, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Requires peace officer to ensure medical aid is rendered by medical personnel to person who indicates he or she cannot breathe as soon as practicable
- Requires each law enforcement agency to adopt written policies and procedures governing performance of copyrighted works by peace officers
 - Such policies must prohibit peace officer from doing so for the purpose of preventing or interfering with the dissemination or sharing of a recording of the peace officer performing his/her duties
 - Prohibits retaliation against peace officer who discloses information about such
- *Authorizes Department of Motor Vehicles to imprint only a symbol indicating a medical condition on the driver's license or ID card of a person upon request
 - *Effective January 1, 2024

Senate Bill No. 11 (Ch. 446, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Requires Department of Public Safety to adopt regulations authorizing public agency to conduct scheduled inspections to ensure compliance with building and fire codes and laws
 - Prohibits collection of information using unmanned aerial vehicle during such an inspection
 - Prohibits use of information collected from UAV during such inspection from being used for any other purpose
- *Requires Department to adopt regulations establishing list of countries, businesses and entities from which a public agency or law enforcement agency shall not purchase or acquire a UAV or related equipment or services and a list of UAVs and related equipment and services that may not be acquired and further prohibits operation of any such UAV, equipment or services
 - *Effective January 1, 2025

Assembly Bill No. 299 (Ch. 456, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

Creates the Nevada Medal of Distinction and the Nevada Awards and Honors Board

Senate Bill No. 368 (Ch. 457, Stats. 2023)

- Prescribes procedure for removing certain discriminatory restrictions or prohibitions from a written instrument relating to real property
 - Requires Real Estate Division of Department of Business and Industry to prescribe form
- Eliminates declaration of removal of discriminatory restriction or prohibition
 - Requires county records to provide notice to persons who previously recorded such

Senate Bill No. 35 (Ch. 468, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes several crimes relating to fentanyl
- Requires reporting to Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary on issues relating to fentanyl
- Requires establishment of programs for medication-assisted treatment of offenders with substance use disorder
- Requires Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary to conduct interim study on certain matters relating to forensic laboratories

Assembly Bill No. 257 (Ch. 470, Stats. 2023)

- Requires county in whose jurisdiction domestic violence battery by strangulation occurs to pay costs of strangulation forensic medical examination of victim
 - Prohibits charging of costs to victim

Assembly Bill No. 292 (Ch. 473, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Department of Corrections to provide women who are incarcerated a sufficient supply
 of preferred feminine hygiene products at no cost and access to certain necessary medical and
 behavioral health services
- Requires warden or manager of institution or facility to adopt policies relating to conduct between male correctional officers and women who are incarcerated
- Requires Department to provide access to necessary medical and behavioral health care services, including obstetrical services, to woman who is pregnant and in custody of Department
 - Requires persons responsible for management of institution or facility to adopt policy for prenatal and postnatal care
 - Requires report if restraints are used on pregnant offender

Assembly Bill No. 290 (Ch. 474, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes dealer and purchaser to enter into written return agreement to cancel a vehicle sale in certain circumstances
- Revises provisions relating to registration of certain vehicles when certificate of title is lost, unlawfully detained or otherwise not available

Assembly Bill No. 266 (Ch. 477, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Requires local governments to designate employee to be responsible for developing and biennially revising a language access plan and submit plan to Office for New Americans
 - Director of Office to biennially submit recommendations for legislation relating to language access plans
 - Director to employ language access coordinator
- *Requires Washoe and Clark Counties and Cities of Henderson, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Reno and Sparks to ensure public notice issued by planning commission includes link to Internet website of city or county with public notice in every language in which voting materials are required to be prepared
 - *Effective January 1, 2024

Assembly Bill No. 321 (Ch. 483, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes requirements and restrictions for foil balloons sold in Nevada
 - Prohibits sale or manufacturing of foil balloon that fails to meet certain requirements
 - Requires Public Utilities Commission of Nevada to adopt standard for testing and evaluation of dielectric performance of foil balloons
- Establishes enhanced penalties for assault or battery on a utility worker
- Creates crime for committing certain acts against infrastructure of public utility

Assembly Bill No. 404 (Ch. 493, Stats. 2023)

- Increases tort cap for professional negligence by provider of health care from \$350,000 to \$750,000 by annual steps of \$80,000 per year starting January 1, 2024
 - After cap reaches \$750,000, increases cap by 2.1 percent on January 1 of each year thereafter
- Requires action against provider of health care to be brought within 3 years after date of injury or 2 years after plaintiff discovers or should have discovered injury
- Limits amount of contingent fee for attorney in such cases to 35 percent of amount recovered

Assembly Bill No. 524 (Ch. 495, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes certain requirements for integrated resource plan of an electric utility
 - Required to submit plan at least once every 3 years
 - Required to hold consumer session before filing or amending plan
- Authorizes electric utility to file general rate application more frequently than once every 3 years
 - Prohibits affiliate of utility from filing general rate application until all pending applications are decided

Assembly Bill No. 231 (Ch. 505, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Enacts the 2022 amendments to the Uniform Commercial Code and the 2018 amendments to Article 9 of the Code

Senate Bill No. 385 (Ch. 524, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023*

- Requires hospital that discharges patient to ensure patient or person with responsibility for patient meets or knows how to contact any dietician assigned to care team for patient during rehabilitation
- *Requires Director of Department of Health and Human Services to include Medicaid coverage for: (1) filling of cavities; (2) making and placement of temporary and permanent crowns; (3) removable dentures; and (4) polycarbonate lenses
 - *Effective January 1, 2024

Senate Bill No. 363 (Ch. 526, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Authorizes Housing Division of Department of Business and Industry to prioritize funding for affordable housing projects that give preference to: (1) women veterans; (2) previously incarcerated women; (3) survivors of domestic violence; (4) elderly women without stable or adequate living arrangements; and (5) unmarried persons with primary physical custody of a child

Senate Bill No. 355 (Ch. 526, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

Revises various provisions relating to commerce

Senate Bill No. 276 (Ch. 534, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2023

• Revises various provisions relating to collection agencies

Laws effective on January 1, 2024

Senate Bill No. 132 (Ch. 6, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits discrimination against a living organ donor in a policy or contract of life insurance, life annuity or health insurance
 - "Living organ donor" means a living person who donates one or more organs (including bone marrow) for medical transplant into body of another person
 - Discrimination includes refusing to insure, refusing to continue insurance, limiting coverage or charging a different rate, premium, deductible, copay or coinsurance

Assembly Bill No. 236 (Ch. 18, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits a psychological scientist who has not been issued a license by the Board of Psychological Examiners and is employed by an accredited educational institution or public agency from representing himself or herself as a psychologist
- Allows the teaching of psychology or psychological research only at an accredited educational institution
 - Allows the use of the title "psychologist" by persons who have earned a doctoral degree in psychology from an accredited educational institution only in connection with such teaching at an accredited educational institution

Assembly Bill No. 136 (Ch. 27, Stats. 2023)

- Requires all qualified residential treatment programs for children to be licensed and regulated as child care institutions
 - "Qualified residential treatment program" defined by federal law (42 U.S.C. § 672(k)(4))
 - Program operating on or before January 1, 2024, allowed to continue operating without a license until July 1, 2024

Assembly Bill No. 53 (Ch. 64, Stats. 2023)

- Increases the penalty for a person licensed to manufacture, distribute and sell various tobacco products who has an employee or agent of the licensee who sells, distributes or offers to sell cigarettes, cigarette paper, products derived from or containing tobacco, vapor products, alternative nicotine products or any product derived from or containing nicotine to a person under the age of 21 years to:
 - For a first offense within a 24-month period at a location, \$2,500
 - For a second offense within a 24-month period at a location, \$5,000
 - For a third offense within a 24-month period at a location, \$7,500
 - For the fourth and each subsequent offense within a 24-month period at a location, \$10,000

Assembly Bill No. 131 (Ch. 74, Stats. 2023)

- Creates the Urban and Community Forestry Program within the Division of Forestry of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources
 - Requires the State Forester Firewarden to administer the Program
- Requires the Division to provide technical assistance to political subdivisions for certain purposes relating to urban and community forestry
- Authorizes the State Forester Firewarden to develop a program to award grants to political subdivision, Indian tribes and nonprofit organizations for certain purposes relating to urban and community forestry

Assembly Bill No. 162 (Ch. 76, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits the purchase or use of neonicotinoid pesticides on plants in this State except for commercial agricultural use
 - Requires a person seeking commercial agricultural use of neonicotinoid pesticides to obtain a certificate from the State Department of Agriculture

Assembly Bill No. 154 (Ch. 84, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Division of Public and Behavioral Health of Department of Health and Human Services to publish Internet website with a list of entities that accept living donations of birth tissue
- Authorizes Division to include certain other information on such a website
- Requires hospital or physician practicing in obstetrics and gynecology to provide patient who is pregnant with link to such a website or printed copy of list

Assembly Bill No. 289 (Ch. 85, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes the use of natural organic reduction for disposition of human remains
- Authorizes the Nevada Funeral and Cemetery Services Board to adopt regulations regarding natural organic reduction of human remains

Assembly Bill No. 318 (Ch. 87, Stats. 2023)

- Directs proceeds from fines imposed by Board of Medical Examiners to an account to support the improvement of health care or practice of medicine in this State, rather than State General Fund
 - Increases maximum amount of such a fine from \$5,000 to \$10,000
- Requires Board to notify holder of license to practice medicine at least 60 days before expiration of the license and to make reasonable efforts to notify licensee of expiration
- Applies certain provisions of law relating to investigation and reporting of malpractice and sanctions against physicians to physician assistants, practitioners of respiratory care and perfusionists as well

Assembly Bill No. 343 (Ch. 88, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the qualifications required to receive a license as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant
- Authorizes issuance of license by reciprocity as an occupational therapist or occupational
 therapy assistant to certain persons who hold valid and unrestricted license in a state that is a
 member of the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact
- Revises provisions relating to issuance of a temporary license and authorizes issuance of a provisional license

Assembly Bill No. 185 (Ch. 90, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes charter school to give preference in enrollment to child who has a parent or legal guardian who is a member of the military
- Requires public school to allow a pupil transferring into a public school as a result of a military transfer of a parent or legal guardian of the pupil to enroll in school and participate in any application or lottery process necessary to be eligible for enrollment at the same time as pupils who live in the relevant area
- Requires public school to provide certain additional assistance for a pupil to successfully transfer in or out of the public school as a result of such a military transfer

Assembly Bill No. 210 (Ch. 92, Stats. 2023)

- Requires each contractor engaged on a public work to provide each worker at the time of hire
 with written or electronic notice including website of Labor Commissioner posting prevailing
 wages for the public work project, name of the contractor and physical address of principal place
 of business of the contractor
 - Requires such a contractor to obtain acknowledgement of receipt of such notice and retain for 2 years
- Requires a person found to have willfully and repeatedly failed to pay prevailing wage to pay an affected worker damages in an amount equal to the difference between the prevailing wage required to be paid and the wage actually paid

Assembly Bill No. 414 (Ch. 98, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes a form to create an advance health-care directive and repeals existing form for power of attorney for health care
- Removes requirement for witnesses to a principal's signature on a power of attorney for health care personally know the principal
 - Prohibits owner, operator or employee of nursing home in which principal resides from witnessing signature
 - Removes requirement to attach certificate of competency for principal who lives in certain health care facilities

Assembly Bill No. 56 (Ch. 125, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes certain vehicles to drive on the paved shoulder of a highway or controlled-access highway in certain circumstances
- Prohibits a driver from stopping on paved shoulder of highway which is signed to allow certain vehicles to drive on shoulder

Senate Bill No. 442 (Ch. 139, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Enacts the Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact

Senate Bill No. 298 (Ch. 145, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Revises various provisions governing residential facilities for groups

Senate Bill No. 194 (Ch. 151, Stats. 2023)

- Requires certain private-sector insurers to establish a process for an insured to request an exemption from a step therapy protocol that applies to prescription drugs and appeal a decision concerning such a request
 - Insurer required to grant such a request if attending practitioner submits adequate justification

Assembly Bill No. 342 (Ch. 156, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Codifies existing regulation requiring cannabis establishment agent to verify age of consumer by checking government-issued photo ID using an identification scanner approved by agent of Cannabis Compliance Board before selling cannabis or cannabis products to a consumer

Senate Bill No. 323 (Ch. 158, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Requires Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing standards for reciprocity of person from another state or Federal Government with a certification or training equivalent to a category III peace officer

Senate Bill No. 393 (Ch. 161, Stats. 2023)

- Revises the circumstances under which a rate paid for dental coverage is presumed to be excessive
- Establishes certain procedures to enforce the prohibition on imposing excessive rates for dental coverage

Senate Bill No. 422 (Ch. 169, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Establishes provisions governing the operation of a personal delivery device

Senate Bill No. 423 (Ch. 170, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024*

- Eliminates requirements to be a resident of Nevada or member of the Armed Forces stationed in Nevada and to have held a motorcycle license or endorsement for 2 years to obtain an endorsement as an instructor in the Program for the Education of Motorcycle Riders
- *Requires a court to allow a person who drives a motorcycle without a license to complete a course in motorcycle safety in lieu of fine within 9 months of court's order
 - *Effective January 1, 2025

Assembly Bill No. 35 (Ch. 177, Stats. 2023)

- Requires warden or manager of each institution or facility to determine which telecommunications devices, if any, are authorized for use by an offender
- Requires the Director of the Department of Corrections to adopt regulations authorizing offenders to possess and use an authorized telecommunications device for certain purposes

Assembly Bill No. 169 (Ch. 186, Stats. 2023)

- Requires each package or box containing a feminine hygiene product that is manufactured on or after January 1, 2025, for sale or distribution in this state to bear a label containing certain information
 - Requires such information to additionally be posted on Internet website of manufacturer
 - Requires information on such packaging to be updated within 18 months, and on such an Internet website within 6 months, after change to ingredients

Senate Bill No. 293 (Ch. 193, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to agreements for purchase or lease of distributed generation system or power purchase agreement
- Imposes various requirements on solar installation companies
- Prohibiting a person from engaging in certain activities relating to residential photovoltaic systems unless the person is licensed by the State Contractors' Board or is an employee of such a person

Assembly Bill No. 267 (Ch. 202, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Establishes requirements for training in cultural competency and diversity, equity and inclusion for various providers of health care and health care facilities

Assembly Bill No. 163 (Ch 207, Stats. 2023)

- Extends requirement for employer to provide certain leave and reasonable accommodations to, and not take certain actions against or condition employment of, victims of domestic violence to include victims of sexual assault
- Prohibits denial of unemployment benefits for persons who leave employment to protect self or family members from sexual assault and actively engaged in efforts to preserve employment

Senate Bill No. 211 (Ch. 214, Stats. 2023)

- Requires county clerk to issue amended marriage certificate to person whose name has changed
- Eliminates ability for applicant for marriage license to change middle or last name as part of marriage license process

Assembly Bill No. 410 (Ch. 217, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Expands stress-related injuries compensable under industrial insurance to include first responders who witnessed, in course of employment, a death or aftermath thereof resulting from violence or injury or aftermath thereof involving grievous bodily harm of a nature that shocks the conscience

Senate Bill No. 330 (Ch. 218, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Requires certain health insurance plans to provide certain additional breast cancer screening and diagnostic tests

Senate Bill No. 317 (Ch. 226, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Authorizes provider of homeless services to allow person experiencing homelessness to use provider's address as temporary mailing address

Senate Bill No. 92 (Ch. 228, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024*

- Generally authorizes certain sales by sidewalk vendors in Clark and Washoe Counties
 - Authorizes local governments to establish certain ordinances for licensing and regulation of sidewalk vendors
 - Limits practice of sidewalk vending to certain locations (at least 1,500 feet away from resort hotel, certain event or convention facilities or the Las Vegas sign, unless location is in a neighborhood)
 - *Allows certain time, place and manner restrictions, effective July 1, 2024
 - · Requires sidewalk vendor to obtain any necessary requirements from local board of health
 - Creates Task Force on Safe Sidewalk Vending

Senate Bill No. 346 (Ch. 233, Stats. 2023)

- Generally allows various processes of the Department of Motor Vehicles to be conducted electronically
- Requires issuance of special license plates for vehicles wholly powered by electric motor
- Regulates the use of autocycles

Senate Bill No. 232 (Ch. 236, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Requires State Plan for Medicaid to include coverage for postpartum care services for 12 months following the end of a pregnancy

Senate Bill No. 281 (Ch. 243, Stats. 2023)

- Requires public utilities providing natural gas to customers to file a triennial plan to meet the current and future demand for natural gas at the lowest reasonable cost with the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada
 - Prohibits such a utility from filing general rate application within 180 days of filing triennial plan

Senate Bill No. 216 (Ch. 244, Stats. 2023)

- Requires city and county clerks to meet with relevant Indian tribes to plan for election cycles
- Requires Secretary of State to allow tribal voters living on reservation or colony to vote electronically

Assembly Bill No. 184 (Ch. 245, Stats. 2023)

- Creates the Account for Clean Trucks and Buses and the Clean Trucks and Buses Incentive Program
 - Provides monetary incentives to certain Nevada-based businesses to replace diesel- or gasoline-powered medium- or heavy-duty trucks and buses with zero emissions trucks and buses

Assembly Bill No. 270 (Ch. 247, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Provides for licensure and regulation of anesthesiologist assistants

Assembly Bill No. 153 (Ch. 251, Stats. 2023)

- Regulates the practice of naprapathy and creates the Naprapathic Practice Advisory Board
 - "Naprapathy" is the use of certain techniques to diagnose and treat various injuries and connective tissue disorders

Assembly Bill No. 161 (Ch. 252, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles, upon application by a person with a communication need, to place a designation on the vehicle registration, driver's license or identification card of such a person

Assembly Bill No. 403 (Ch. 255, Stats. 2023)

- Removes halfway houses for persons recovering from alcohol or other substance use disorders from the definition of "facility for the dependent" and renames such houses as "recovery houses for persons recovering from alcohol or other substance use disorders"
 - Effect: Such houses no longer licensed by Division of Public and Behavioral Health of Department of Health and Human Services, but must be certified by Division to receive public money

Assembly Bill No. 45 (Ch. 265, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Creates the Student Loan Repayment for Providers of Health Care in Underserved Communities Program to repay the student education loans of qualified providers of health care who work in certain underserved communities

Senate Bill No. 222 (Ch. 268, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

Revises provisions governing jurors

Senate Bill No. 45 (Ch. 274, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Establishes a minimum amount for the personal needs allowance provided to certain recipients of Medicaid who reside in facilities for skilled nursing

Senate Bill No. 163 (Ch. 376, Stats. 2023)

- Requires certain health insurance to include coverage for treatment of conditions relating to gender dysphoria and gender incongruence
 - Prohibits such insurers from discriminating on the basis of gender identity or expression

Senate Bill No. 191 (Ch. 382, Stats. 2023)

- Requires State Plan for Medicaid to cover certain services related to applied behavior analysis
- Increases maximum fee for licensure as behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst

Senate Bill No. 241 (Ch. 383, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Requires State Plan for Medicaid to provide coverage for certain services at a critical access hospital and sets rate of reimbursement for such services under Medicaid

Senate Bill No. 161 (Ch. 385, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits insurer from requiring prior authorization for contraceptive drugs and requires coverage for contraceptive services provided by pharmacist to same extent as by another provider of health care
- Prescribes limitations on copay or coinsurance requirements for contraceptive drugs and requires insurer to demonstrate capacity to adequately deliver family planning services provided by pharmacists to covered persons
- Requires Department of Public and Behavioral Health to authorize persons receiving public benefits to purchase menstrual products with those benefits to the extent allowed by federal law
- Adopts the Interstate Massage Compact

Assembly Bill No. 444 (Ch. 389, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes various provisions concerning proceedings in which the legal or physical custody of an Indian child who may be in need of protection is an issue
- Establishes provisions relating to the adoption of Indian children

Assembly Bill No. 434 (Ch. 390, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits certain pharmacy benefit managers and health carriers from taking actions against entities that participate in a federal program to facilitate the discounted purchase of prescription drugs
 - Prohibits program administered by Department of Health and Human Services to provide therapeutics to persons with human immunodeficiency virus from taking similar actions

Senate Bill No. 279 (Ch. 395, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes the State as a Model Employer Program
 - Generally designed to ensure implementation of best practices relating to hiring, promotion and retention of persons with disabilities

Assembly Bill No. 156 (Ch. 398, Stats. 2023)

- Authorizes separate accounting of money received by Division of Public and Behavioral Health of Department of Health and Human Services for purchase of opioid antagonists
- Establishes prioritization of persons for participation in certain publicly funded programs for treatment of alcohol or other substance use disorders
- Authorizes pharmacist to prescribe and dispense drugs for medication-assisted treatment of opioid use disorder
- Requires certain health plans to cover such drugs
- Prescribes requirements concerning diagnosis and treatment of a patient with opioid use disorder

Senate Bill No. 307 (Ch. 407, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Enacts a variety of provisions relating to solitary confinement for offenders

Senate Bill No. 277 (Ch. 423, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Revises various provisions relating to cannabis

Senate Bill No. 63 (Ch. 427, Stats. 2023)

- Makes various changes relating to the policies and procedures of the Judicial Department
 - · Authorizes judge to hold court by means of remote communication when necessary to promote justice
 - Authorizes certain courts to hold business on nonjudicial days electronically for certain protection orders
 - Revises procedure to disqualify certain judges for bias or prejudice
 - Prohibits full-time judges or justices of peace from having associate acting as an attorney in Nevada courts
 - Revises term for policies of Judicial Department to "rule", rather than "regulation"
 - Revises provisions relating to court interpreters

Assembly Bill No. 139 (Ch. 430, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Requires agencies that collect demographic information on race or ethnicity to include a separate category for persons of Middle Eastern or North African descent

Senate Bill No. 311 (Ch. 444, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Authorizes Board of Wildlife Commissioners to adopt regulations establishing a program allowing person to transfer tag to hunt big game animal to person under 18 years of age

Assembly Bill No. 430 (Ch. 450, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Applies excise tax on wholesale sale of cannabis only to the first wholesale sale and assesses tax at rate of 15 percent of fair market value (for sale to an affiliate) or sales price (for sale not made to an affiliate)

Assembly Bill No. 260 (Ch. 455, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Exempts veterans service organizations and agents or officers thereof from certain fees on persons conducting business in Nevada

Senate Bill No. 82 (Ch. 462, Stats. 2023)

- If apprentices in appropriate craft or type of work are not available, authorizes person who graduated from apprenticeship program to be used and deemed an apprentice for the purpose of satisfying requirement to use a certain minimum percentage of apprentices on public works
- Contractor or subcontractor on public work required to maintain documentation to show good faith effort to satisfy apprenticeship requirements on public works
 - Reporting on use of apprentices to Labor Commissioner required
- Labor Commissioner authorized to impose penalties against contractor or subcontractor who fails to satisfy apprenticeship requirement on public works and does not show good cause

Assembly Bill No. 452 (Ch. 465, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Director of Department of Corrections to adopt regulations establishing program for the visitation of offenders
 - Requires warden or manager to provide certain notice regarding cancellation of visitation
- Establishes Office of Ombudsperson for Offenders

Assembly Bill No. 332 (Ch. 466, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Provides for the licensing and regulation of student loan servicers by Commissioner of Financial Institutions

Assembly Bill No. 376 (Ch. 467, Stats. 2023)

- Provides employees of Executive Department with 8 weeks of paid family leave over the course of a 12-month period
 - Eligibility: employed by State for at least 12 consecutive months, accrued at least 40 hours of sick leave, used any hours of sick leave in excess of 40 hours before using paid family leave
 - Employee on such leave is paid at 50 percent of regular wage

Assembly Bill No. 286 (Ch. 469, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Requires person who administers jail to establish policy that ensures person detained in jail may register to vote and vote in an election

Assembly Bill No. 304 (Ch. 472, Stats. 2023)

- Revises provisions relating to special license plates
 - Exempts plate encouraging donation of human organs from provisions limiting number of designs issued by Department of Motor Vehicles
 - Eliminates requirement to provide proof of employment for renewal of plate recognizing service as firefighter

Assembly Bill No. 277 (Ch. 476, Stats. 2023)

- Establishes rural emergency hospitals as a type of licensed medical facility
 - Authorizes rural emergency hospital meeting certain requirements to be endorsed as a crisis stabilization center
 - Authorizes Department of Health and Human Services to apply for waiver or amendment to State Plan for Medicaid to provide increased rates of reimbursement for certain services provided by a rural emergency hospital

Assembly Bill No. 310 (Ch. 481, Stats. 2023)

- Requires Housing Division of Department of Business and Industry to develop and implement a supportive housing grant program
 - Creates Nevada Supportive Housing Development Fund in State Treasury

Assembly Bill No. 389 (Ch. 489, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Requires Director of Department of Health and Human Services to apply for a waiver to allow Medicaid to provide certain coverage to certain persons who are incarcerated

Assembly Bill No. 216 (Ch. 508, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

 Revises various provisions of law relating to travel insurance to conform more closely to the Travel Insurance Model Act

Assembly Bill No. 147 (Ch. 513, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

Revises various provisions relating to dentistry

Senate Bill No. 196 (Ch. 521, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits coaches and related personnel from requiring pupil to participate in club sports as a condition for participating in school sports
 - Requires system of progressive discipline for violations
 - Requires reporting of association with club sports related to school sports by coaches
 - Requires notice to pupils and parents of certain rights afforded to pupil before participation in school sport
- Authorizes a pupil who was enrolled in high school during COVID-19 state of emergency to participate in school sports for up to 10 semesters and 5 seasons if the pupil has not completed credits to graduate and receive high school diploma

Senate Bill No. 310 (Ch. 523, Stats. 2023)

- Provides for licensure and regulation of expanded function dental assistants
- Creates special endorsement for dental hygienists to practice restorative dental hygiene
- Authorizes certain dental hygienists to prescribe and dispense certain drugs
- Authorizing public health dental hygienist to authorize an expanded function dental assistant or dental assistant to perform certain tasks as part of approved program of public health dental hygiene

Senate Bill No. 439 (Ch. 528, Stats. 2023)

- Revises various provisions relating to communicable diseases
 - Requires certain state/local agencies to develop policies for uninterrupted services during emergency to persons with or at high risk of HIV
 - Requires public or private detention facility to take certain measures to ensure access of prisoners to treatment for and methods to prevent acquisition of HIV
 - Requires public and private health plans to cover condoms for certain persons and testing, treatment and prevention of STDs
 - Requires certain health plans to cover all approved drugs for treating HIV or hepatitis C without restrictions other than step therapy and to reimburse APRN at same rate as physician for such services
 - Requires certain health care providers to complete training relating to HIV

Senate Bill No. 274 (Ch. 535, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2024

• Revises various provisions relating to industrial insurance

Laws effective on July 1, 2024

Assembly Bill No. 264 (Ch. 95, Stats. 2023)

- Excludes absences for observance of religious holiday from absences counted for purpose of accounting of attendance by school districts
 - Such an absence is not an absence for the purpose of annual report of accountability
- Requires days on which pupil is absent for observance of religious holiday to be credited towards days of attendance if absence approved and pupil completes course-work requirements
- Exempts pupil from being truant on the basis of not more than 5 absences for religious holiday in a school year
 - Requires parent or guardian to notify teacher or principal in writing at least 3 days before absence
- Prohibits pupil enrolled in public school from being deprived of award based on perfect attendance because of approved absence for religious holiday

Assembly Bill No. 241 (Ch. 201, Stats. 2023)

- Requires, with certain exceptions, all pupils enrolled in a public high school to enroll in the courses and credits necessary to receive a college and career ready high school diploma or an equivalent or higher diploma offered by a school district
 - Applies to pupils first enrolled in grade 9 for the 2024-2025 school year in Clark or Washoe Counties
 - Applies to pupils first enrolled in grade 9 for the 2026-2027 school year in all other counties

Assembly Bill No. 193 (Ch. 208, Stats. 2023)

- Prohibits police or other persons conducting custodial interrogation of a child from:
 - Knowingly making false statements about evidence to the child; or
 - Making express or implied promises of leniency or advantage to the child
- Establishes presumption of inadmissibility for any statement obtained in violation of above
 - But allows exception from above if interrogator reasonably believed imminent threat to life or property exists and information was necessary to protect against threat

Senate Bill No. 80 (Ch. 219, Stats. 2023)

- Revises requirements for policy concerning injuries to the head that must be adopted by the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association regarding return-to-play by a pupil
- Requires Superintendent of Public Instruction to adopt policy concerning injuries to the head regarding return by a pupil to the classroom ("return-to-learn")
- Requires public schools to have policies consistent with NIAA and Superintendent's policies
- (Proposed by Nevada Youth Legislature)

Senate Bill No. 282 (Ch. 276, Stats. 2023)

- Clarifies that principal of local school precinct in large school district must select staff in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining agreement
- Makes principal of local school precinct a voting member of the school organizational team
- Requires approval of plan of operation for LSP by at least 75% vote of SOT
 - If no 75% vote to approve, district superintendent establishes plan of operation
- Revises process for SOT to recommend/reject principal for LSP in the event of a vacancy
- Prohibits LSP from carrying forward reserve of more than 5%
 - Excess must be spent within 24 months from end of relevant school year

Assembly Bill No. 7 (Ch. 278, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2024

• Revises provisions relating to electronic transmission of health information and generally requires health information to be transmitted electronically

Assembly Bill No. 138 (Ch. 392, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2024

• Requires State Plan for Medicaid to include coverage for behavioral health services delivered through evidence-based behavioral health integration models

Senate Bill No. 290 (Ch. 400, Stats. 2023)

- Imposes licensing and regulatory requirements on earned wage access services
- Authorizes Commissioner of Financial Institutions to participate in the Nationwide Multistate Licensing System and Registry

Assembly Bill No. 516 (Ch. 453, Stats. 2023)

- Creates Department of Native American Affairs
 - Transfers Nevada Indian Commission to Department
 - Transfers administration of Account for the Protection and Rehabilitation of the Stewart Indian School to Executive Director of Department

Laws with other effective dates

Assembly Bill No. 274 (Ch. 29, Stats. 2023)

- Requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction, rather than the Governor, to appoint the members of the State Financial Literacy Advisory Council
 - Eliminates certain members appointed by the Governor, Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education and Legislators
 - Includes appointment of one member who is a pupil enrolled in high school
- Requires the one-half unit of credit in economics in which high school pupils are required to enroll to include financial literacy
- Requires instruction in financial literacy to include understanding and budgeting for the costs of housing, transportation and health care

Assembly Bill No. 118 (Ch. 72, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2028*

- Reduces the size of the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from 13 members to 9
- Decreases the term length for members of the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from 6 years to 4 years
- *These changes become effective prospectively so as to first apply during the elections to the Board of Regents occurring in 2024 for the purpose of reducing terms to 4 years and to the elections occurring in 2028 for the purpose of reducing the total number of members to 9

Senate Bill No. 237 (Ch. 235, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 9, 2023

• Revises provisions governing the imposition of a surcharge on certain communications services to support a suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline

Senate Bill No. 506 (Ch. 366, Stats. 2023)

Effective October 1, 2024

- Authorizes use of money collected by Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal
 History for distribution of certain publications and reports to be used for any purpose authorized
 by Legislature and requires balance of such money at the end of each fiscal year to revert to the
 State General Fund
 - Makes similar changes for similar fees charged by agencies of criminal justice

Senate Bill No. 413 (Ch. 394, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2025

• Revises various provisions relating to sentencing, institutional programming and determination of credits to reduce sentences of offenders

Senate Bill No. 110 (Ch. 402, Stats. 2023)

Effective July 1, 2028

• Requires vehicles operating on certain highways with one lane for traveling in each direction to display daytime running lamps or lighted lamps and illuminating devices at certain times

Senate Bill No. 205 (Ch. 442, Stats. 2023)

Effective when DMV confirms resources are available to carry out

- Revises various provisions relating to off-highway vehicles
 - Generally authorizes either annual or triennial registration

Senate Bill No. 305 (Ch. 461, Stats. 2023)

- Creates Board of Trustees of the Nevada Employees Savings Trust and authorizes Board to create the Nevada Employees Savings Trust Program
 - Generally requires employers with more than 5 employees in Nevada with no tax-favored retirement plan for its employees to participate in the Program and automatically enroll employees in IRAs with Program

Assembly Bill No. 259 (Ch. 479, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2025

• Revises various provisions relating to providers of jobs and day training services

Assembly Bill No. 203 (Ch. 509, Stats. 2023)

Effective when DMV confirms resources are available to carry out

- Authorizes combination of personalized prestige plates with certain special license plates associated with military or public service
- Expands exemption from payment of parking fees in Nevada to any vehicle that displays certain special license plates, regardless of whether person to whom plates were issued has suffered a qualifying service-connected disability

Assembly Bill No. 208 (Ch. 510, Stats. 2023)

Effective January 1, 2025

• Establishes program to provide structured family caregiving to certain recipients of Medicaid

Senate Bill No. 370 (Ch. 525, Stats. 2023)

Effective March 31, 2024

• Prescribes various protections for consumer health data maintained and used by other persons and nongovernmental entities
